In accordance with Title 27, California Code of Regulations (27CCR) §21660.3, please be advised that the County of San Diego Department of Environmental Health Solid Waste Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) has received and accepted an application for a Medium Volume Transfer/Processing Facility for Otay Landfill Inc. The LEA is certified by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) to enforce state laws and regulations at solid waste facilities within the County of San Diego, excluding the City of San Diego.

Description of Project

A new Medium Volume Transfer and Processing facility that will receive and process up to 100 tons per day of source separated organic material (food waste/green waste) within an enclosed 10,000 square foot building. The facility hours of operation are Monday to Saturday from 6:00 AM to 5:00 PM. The facility will operate within a 10,000 square feet area that is located within the Otay Landfill (Landfill) permitted property boundary.

LEA Determination: The operation is defined and authorized by California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Division 7, Chapter 3, Article 6.0. The LEA has accepted the application for a new registration permit as complete and correct. The issuance of a new Registration Permit to Otay Organics Station is a ministerial action by the LEA and not subject to CEQA. This permit does not change the Otay Landfill facility or operations in a manner that would require a permit change; however, an Report of Facility Information (RFI) amendment for the Otay Landfill will be processed separately to identify the Otay Organics Station (OOS) within the approved footprint for solid waste activities. Wastes received at the OOS will cross the landfill scales counted as part of the 1,167 tons per day for beneficial reuse and in addition to the 6,700 tons per day received at the landfill.
