Project Description: This project consists of the sale of approximately 11.71-acre parcel that has been declared surplus government property by the County of San Diego Board of Supervisors ("Board"). The project includes: adopting a Resolution declaring intention to sell the subject property and notice inviting bids; directing the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to post the adopted Resolution and advertise notice; authorizing Director, General Services, or designee, to conduct bid opening and select the highest bidder and return to the Board for approval of sale; exploring how excess revenue from the future sale of Edgemoor Remainder Parcel identified as APN 381-050-81 can be utilized to facilitate the development of Missing Middle housing on County owned property.

This is to advise that the County of San Diego Board of Supervisors has approved the above-described project on February 10, 2026 (#), and found the project to be exempt from the CEQA under the following criteria:

Statement of reasons why project is exempt:

The sale of surplus government property through the County of San Diego's bid process is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to Section 15312, Surplus Government Property Sales, as it involves the sale of surplus government property not located in an area of statewide, regional, or areawide concern identified in Section 15206(b)(4) of CEQA Guidelines. Further, no exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 apply to the project. Additionally, the project will not impact environmental resources of hazardous or critical concern that are designated, precisely mapped and officially adopted by government agencies; does not contribute to cumulative environmental impact; will not have a significant impact on the environment due to unusual circumstances; does not damage scenic resources within a designated state scenic highway; and is not on the list of Hazardous Waste and Substance Sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.
