



Dan Frazee

Dan Frazee was appointed to the McClellan-Palomar Airport Advisory Committee (PAAC) as a member-at-large in November, 2016. He was the Director, Airport Noise Mitigation, at San Diego International Airport (SAN) from 2002 until 2014. He developed policy and administered a State of California mandated annual \$15 million Airport Noise Compatibility Program for SAN. His Department monitored and enforced compliance with local, State and Federal environmental regulations and laws. He acted as community advocate for aircraft noise-related matters to Airport Authority Board, City and County of San Diego, and State legislative bodies. He authored a series of web-based presentations to educate aircraft noise-impacted community members about the mechanics of aircraft noise, applicable and relevant Federal, State, and local rules, regulations, and policies, including the roles and responsibilities of parties involved in addressing noise management and mitigation issues.

Previously Dan served in Airport Operations at Sacramento International Airport. He holds an FAA Airline Transport Pilot rating in three aircraft and is an FAA Certified Instrument Flight Instructor.

He is a retired US Air Force pilot and Army aviator with over 8,000 hours in rotary and fixed-wing aircraft, and has previous experience as a military Air Traffic Controller. Dan holds an MS from the University of North Texas.

Dan's interests include Airport Operations and Management, Crisis Intervention, Community Mediation, and Civilian Oversight of Law Enforcement. He was a member of San Diego's Citizen Review Board on Police Practices (CRB) from 2005-2012, and Chaired that Board from 2010-2012.
