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1. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS OVERVIEW

The Department of Public Works (DPW) provides a broad range of essential services throughout the unincorporated areas of San Diego County. These services include, but are not limited to: the operation and maintenance of County roads; traffic engineering and management; inspection of private development construction; design engineering and construction management for public infrastructure; land surveying and map processing; watershed protection and flood control; operation and maintenance of County airports; solid waste planning and diversion efforts; monitoring and maintenance of closed landfills; management of wastewater and water systems; and oversight of private road and landscape maintenance assessment districts.

2. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS MISSION STATEMENT

The Department of Public Works preserves, enhances and promotes quality of life and public safety through the responsible development and maintenance of reliable and sustainable infrastructure and services in the unincorporated region.

COMMITMENT

4. CAPITAL PROJECTS & CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

The Department of Public Works' (DPW) Capital Improvement Program is a comprehensive program dedicated to enhancing infrastructure in the unincorporated areas of the County. The Capital Improvement Program focuses on upgrading roads and bridges, facilities at the County's eight airports and airstrips, flood control systems, and wastewater facilities owned and operated by the County. These improvements are designed to ensure safe, vibrant neighborhoods where residents can live, work, and play; foster environments that support thriving, livable communities and promote economic growth; enhance opportunities for healthy living for all ages; and ensure equitable access for all residents.

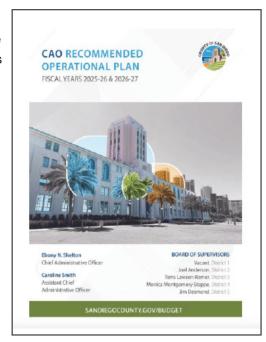
The Capital Improvement Program is composed of project managers, design team leaders, design engineers, engineering technicians, utility and right-of-way coordinators, contract administration staff, and administrative and financial support personnel. The Capital Improvement Program is responsible for planning, budgeting, design, environmental clearance, permitting, right-of-way acquisition, utility coordination, and construction engineering and management of a diverse range of capital improvement projects. These projects enhance various types of infrastructure, including roads, bridges, flood control systems, wastewater, and drainage facilities.

5. COUNTY ROAD CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUNDING

The Capital Improvement Program is funded through various revenue sources. Each year, the County Board of Supervisors (BOS) approves project funding as part of the annual fiscal year budget. Additional funding is approved at regularly scheduled BOS meetings when designs are finalized, and projects are ready for bidding and construction contract awards. On average, over 130 projects are active and in various stages of development during each fiscal year. The following is a brief description of the various funding sources..

Statewide Highway Users Tax Account (HUTA) – "The Gas Tax" is a source of funds for the overall county road maintenance and safety improvement program. The State of California collects 61.2 cents for every gallon of gasoline sold. The State distributes money to California counties based on the number of registered vehicles and miles of roads maintained. This money becomes a special revenue fund called the Road Fund which must be used for road and transportation purposes.

Road Repair & Accountability Act of 2017 (**SB1**) is a major source of funds for the overall county road maintenance program. As part of this legislation, the Department of Public Works (DPW) has received approximately \$354 million of road maintenance revenues over the last 7 years and continues to receive annual revenues in addition to existing funding DPW receives to maintain County roads.



TransNet – A local, ½ cent sales tax was approved by San Diego County voters in 2004 and became effective in 2008. It provides approximately \$21 million annually for projects in the unincorporated County of San Diego over 40 years and will end in 2048. TransNet is allocated to specific road improvement projects approved by the County Board of Supervisors and subsequently approved by the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) which is designated as the regional planning authority.

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) - Funds from the economic stimulus bill passed in 2021.

Transportation Impact Fee (TIF) – The TIF program provides funding for design and construction of transportation facilities needed to support traffic generated by new development and to meet state law requirements. The County no longer collects TIF for new building permits.

Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) – FHWA provides funding for specific roads and bridges. FHWA funding is administered through Caltrans and includes several grant programs. The Highway Bridge Program (HBBR and HBP) is used to replace or rehabilitate county bridges.

Airport Enterprise Fund (AEF) – This fund is used to account for the maintenance, operations and development of county airports. The AEF is funded by revenues generated from County airports and used in the capital program as a required funding match for FAA grants.

Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) – FAA provides funding for a variety of airport improvements.

Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) – Federal funds to small cities and counties for community development and economic development activities such as sidewalks.

Federal Emergency Management Authority (FEMA) – Grants are used to make needed repairs after damage by storms or disasters.

Developer Fees – These are funds provided to the County directly by private land developers to mitigate traffic impacts associated with their development projects.

Other Grants – Several other state and federal grants such as Proposition 1B, The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, and The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act are used to fund road improvement projects.

Tribal Grant / Indian Gaming Special Distribution Funds (IGSDF) – Created for local government agencies impacted by tribal gaming, these funds are used to supplement road improvement project funding to mitigate traffic impacts associated with Native American casinos and gaming establishments.

San Diego County Sanitation District – The Sanitation District funds various projects related to its wastewater facility infrastructure. Many projects are maintenance-based such as pipes, lift stations or other facilities that may have deficiencies that warrant repair or replacement. Other projects are capacity-based such as pipes or other facilities that need to be increased in size to provide sufficient capacity to meet growing demands.

Road Fund Fund Balance (RFFB) – Funds apportioned to the County from the Highway Users Tax Account (HUTA) in the Transportation Tax Fund. This fund is not a revenue funding source; rather, it is comprised of the excess revenue over cost from previous years.

Flood Control District (FCD) – Funds from the San Diego County Flood Control District which is responsible for manage watershed and flood control issues in the unincorporated areas of the county.

General Fund – The primary operating fund for the County of San Diego, supporting essential public services including health, safety, and infrastructure through various departments. Sometimes referred to as "OTO" for "One-Time-Only" funding or as "WPP" for funding from the Watershed Protection Program.

6. THE FIVE YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Document Overview

The Five-Year Capital Plan presents the Department of Public Works' (DPW) active infrastructure improvement and major maintenance projects. The projects were identified based on DPW asset and operational plans as well as input from stakeholders including Community Planning and Sponsor Groups and the County Board of Supervisors.

The goal of the plan is to provide a comprehensive overview of current capital projects while communicating the DPW's efforts to implement an infrastructure program aligned with the County's Strategic Initiatives of Sustainability, Equity, Empowerment, Community, and Justice. Each of the projects in the plan are assigned anticipated completion dates and an estimated spending plan for each of the next five years. As projects are developed, scopes, schedules, and costs may change and projects may at times be cancelled due to a variety of factors including changes in known site conditions, utility and right of way constraints, available funding, community input, resource and material availability, and shifting priorities. Many projects listed in the plan are noted as being partially funded and cannot be completed until a funding source has been identified. At the end of the document is a list of unfunded projects for informational purposes.

How to Read the Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan

The plan includes project sheets for projects currently in active development. Readers can locate projects by project type or refer to the indices at the end of the plan to find them listed alphabetically and by community. Each section of the plan is organized alphabetically, with fully funded projects listed first, followed by partially funded projects. Unfunded projects are listed at the end of the document. Each project sheet shows the project's community, title, description, an anticipated expenditure plan, a map showing the project location, and various other details. The following table describes each of the fields on the project sheets.
