



# FY 2023-24 ROAD RESURFACING PROGRAM

## Project Description and Purpose

The County of San Diego (County) Department of Public Works (DPW) maintains nearly 2,000 centerline miles of roads, in unincorporated San Diego county.

On April 28, 2017, the Governor approved Senate Bill 1 (SB1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 to address the statewide funding gap for road maintenance. On May 2, 2017, the County Board of Supervisors established the Road to 70 PCI (Pavement Condition Index) and approved the use of these new funds to improve the overall condition of the County's maintained road system. Fiscal Year 2023-24 is the 7<sup>th</sup> year of this increased funding and DPW has identified a list of road resurfacing locations totaling approximately 100 centerline miles. The list of roads was developed based on operational needs, resident and community planning group input, DPW's pavement management system software, proximity to underserved communities and other factors. Resurfacing will improve the overall condition of the roads and protect them from deterioration and costly future repairs.

## Project Funding

The estimated cost of the project is \$62 million. Funding sources include Committed Road Fund, TransNet and SB1.
