1. 2. Approval, Minutes Apr 2019- Approved; no changes.
3. Chair's Report-None.
4. Staff Reports
 - City of San Diego
 - The City continues implementing the [Polystyrene Foam and Single Use Plastics Ordinance](#) which takes effect May 24. Flyers and posters for businesses to display information to customers are available on the City's website: sandiego.gov/environmental-services/recycling/pf-ban.
 - County
 - The County continues negotiating proposed changes to the construction and demolition recycling ordinance and non-exclusive franchise hauler agreements. The County is also planning a tire amnesty event in Lincoln Acres.
 - Haulers
 - Members discussed the effects of National Sword.
 - EDCO reported shipping more recyclable materials than prior to the implementation of National Sword.
 - Member interest in EDCO PowerPoint presentation with information on future facilities and the current state of recycling.
 - I Love a Clean San Diego
 - A list of I Love a Clean San Diego's upcoming events were shared, including: Spring Valley Community Cleanup (5/11), Kid's Ocean Day (5/16), Clean Canyons for a Clean Coast at Adobe Falls (5/18), Zero Waste Fair in Encinitas (6/1), and Toast the Coast Summer Social (6/6).  - Sierra Club
 - Sierra Club is interested in creating a zero waste subcommittee.
 - The Sierra Club is hosting a free movie screening of "Children's Pool" (5/18). For more information please visit: sandiegosierraclub.org.
 - LWV
 - The League of Women Voters continues the effort to repeal the People's Ordinance. Interest in contacting apartment groups and meeting with City Councilmembers.
4. Public Comments and Communication

- EDCO, City of San Diego, County of San Diego, Zero Waste San Diego, I Love a Clean San Diego, League of Women Voters, and Sierra Club participated in the Balboa Park Earth Fair (4/28) and highlighted its success!
 - Suggestions for future events include: hosting a swap and shop in the Reuse & Repair Area and providing trash talkers with a “Let’s talk trash” sign at zero waste stations.
- The Old Mission Beach Athletic Club will be coordinating recycling efforts for the upcoming Over the Line Tournament (7/13-14, 7/20-21).
- Attendees discussed barriers to increasing recycling infrastructure.

6. Regional Planning Issues-None.

7. Legislative Update

- **AB 187: *Used Mattress Recovery and Recycling Act*.** This bill would revise and recast provisions of the Used Mattress Recovery and Recycling Act.
- **AB 215: *Dumping*.** This bill would create a misdemeanor crime for the fourth or subsequent conviction of illegal dumping on private property punishable by imprisonment in a county jail for up to 30 days and a fine of \$750-\$3,000.
- **AB 729: *Carpet recycling: carpet stewardship*.** This bill would require a carpet stewardship organization to include a contingency plan in the carpet stewardship plan.
- **AB 755: *California tire fee: Stormwater Permit Compliance Fund*.** This bill would increase the California Tire fee by \$1.50 and would continuously appropriate moneys for competitive grants for projects and programs for municipal storm sewer permit compliance requirements that would prevent or remediate zinc pollutants caused by tires in the state.
- **AB 792: *Recycling: plastic beverage containers: minimum recycled content*.** This bill would create a series of graduated minimum recycled content levels for all plastic beverage containers, starting at 25% in 2021.
- **AB 794: *Beverage container recycling: report to the Legislature*.** This bill would require CalRecycle to conduct a study on the changes to the international recycling market since January 1, 2018.
- **AB 815: *Integrated waste management plans: source reduction and recycling element and household hazardous waste element: dual stream recycling programs*.** This bill would require CalRecycle to consider whether the jurisdiction has adopted a dual stream recycling program when considering if the jurisdiction has made a good faith effort to implement its source reduction and recycling element or household hazardous waste element.
- **AB 827: *Solid waste: commercial and organic waste: recycling bins*.** This bill would require certain businesses to provide customers with a recycling bin that is visible, easily accessible, and clearly marked with educational signage.
- **AB 886: *Plastic bags*.** (Failed deadline). Current law requires store operators to establish an at-store recycling program that provides customers the opportunity to return clean plastic carryout bags until January 1, 2020. This bill would extend these requirements until January 1, 2021.
- **SB 54 & AB 1080: *California Circular Economy and Plastic Pollution Reduction Act*.** This bill would establish the California Circular Economy and Plastic Pollution Reduction Act, which would require CalRecycle to adopt regulations to source reduce and recycle 75% of single-use packaging and products sold or distributed in California by 2030.
- **AB 1162: *Lodging establishments: personal care products: small plastic bottles*.** This bill would prohibit lodging establishments from providing a small plastic bottle containing a personal care product.

- **AB 1171:** *Solid waste: food packaging material: local regulation.* This bill would prohibit a jurisdiction from requiring a grocery store to use a certain type of food packaging for any food sold in the grocery store unless the material was accepted in the local curbside program. This bill would also prohibit jurisdiction from prohibiting a grocery store from using a certain type of food packaging for any food sold in the grocery store if the material was accepted in the local curbside program.
- **AB 1583:** *California Recycling Market Development Act.* This bill would delete the prescribed description of the triangle used on all rigid plastic bottles and containers that indicates the resin used to produce the bottle or container.
- **SB 33:** This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation that would address the collapse of foreign recycling markets by reducing solid waste generation, encouraging transition to compostable or recyclable materials, and fostering domestic recycling markets.
- **SB 372:** *Single-use plastic products: extended produce responsibility.* This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation that would address extended producer responsibility for single-use plastic products.
- **SB 405:** *Solid waste: reclaimed asphalt pavement: pilot project: the County of Los Angeles.* This would require the County of Los Angeles to create a pilot project to demonstrate the viability of paving streets, roads, and highways with hot mix asphalt that is composed of between 85% and 100% reclaimed asphalt pavement.
- **SB 424:** *Tobacco products: single-use and multiuse components.* This bill would prohibit a person or entity from selling, giving, or furnishing to another person a cigarette utilizing a single-use filter made of any material, an attachable and single-use plastic device meant to facilitate manual manipulation or filtration of a tobacco product, and a single-use electronic cigarette or vaporizer device.
- **SB 667:** *Greenhouse gases: recycling infrastructure and facilities.* This would require CalRecycle to develop a 5-year investment strategy to drive innovation and support technological development and infrastructure, in order to meet specified organic waste reductions and recycling targets.
- **SB 724:** *The California Beverage Container Recycling and Litter Reduction Act.* This would increase the number of convenience zone exemptions allowable in the California Beverage Container Recycling and Litter Reduction Act.
