Meeting Summary

1. QUORUM

The Chair determined that quorum was not met and called the meeting to order.

2. WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

Jurisdiction representatives and guests introduced themselves.

3. REVIEW OF THE DECEMBER 2, 2021 MEETING SUMMARY

The December 2, 2021, Meeting Summary will be reviewed at the February 3, 2022 meeting.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Geertje Grootenhuis, San Diego Food System Alliance – San Diego Food System Alliance has developed SB 1383 educational resources for hunger relief organizations.

Nita Kurmins Gilson, Produce Good – Produce Good is interested in partnering with local jurisdictions who apply for the CalRecycle SB 1383 assistance grant program.

5. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Eric Wolff, County of San Diego - The County disseminated an educational <u>newsletter</u> on organics and reducing food waste to unincorporated area residents and businesses.

6. CPSC UPDATE

Doug Kobold, California Produce Stewardship Council: The Legislature reconvened on January 3. A legislative update on the following bills was shared:

- AB 659 Doubles fines for illegally dumped livestock carcasses.
- AB 661- Require state agencies to purchase recycled products.
- <u>AB 1067</u>- Would require the department to conduct a study inquiring whether the \$100 per day payment to the department under the California Beverage Container and Litter Reduction Act provides inducement for dealers to meet standards for redemption.
- <u>SB 38</u> Overhaul of the CRV program. Affects curbside blue bins, CCP payments and funding for recycling centers.
- SB 45- Offers funding for local governments for SB 1383.

An update on regulations was shared:

- SB 1335 Regulations have been adopted. There is a resource list on CalRecycle's website and on the CPSC legislation list.
- SB 212- Stewardship plans for both pharma and sharps were due to CalRecycle on July 7, 2021. Penalties start January 7, 2022, if no approved plan. Med-Project submitted a pharma plan on September 14, 2021 that CalRecycle conditionally approved on December 9, 2021. Drug Take Back Solutions Foundation submitted a pharma plan on November 19, 2021. CalRecycle found the Foundation's pharma plan submittal complete on December 20, and has until February 17 to approve, conditionally approve, or reject the plan. Three organizations have submitted sharps plans so far. Med-Project and Ultimed submitted sharp plans that were conditionally approved by CalRecycle on December 9 and 27, respectively. Drug Take Back Solutions submitted a sharps plan on November 19. CalRecycle found the submittal complete on December 20 and has until February 17 to approve, conditionally approve, or reject the plan.

7. PRESENTATIONS

8. CALRECYCLE UPDATE

Roberta Goldenpenny, CalRecycle, reported on the following:

- Sign up for the CalRecycle list serv for updates on various topics.
- The SB 1383 resource webpage has new training materials, tools, and guidance documents.
- There is an organics procurement informational webpage that includes FAQ and a section on procurement of biomass electricity.
- The CalRecycle YouTube page has also been updated.
- CalRecycle continues to assist jurisdictions with SB 1383 programs.
- Additional SB 619 information will be provided in the CalRecycle attachment sent with the Minutes.
- Upcoming events include the Compost Use Best Management Practices Webinar (1/19-20) and the CalRecycle monthly public meeting (1/18).
- An update on grant/loan cycles was shared including SB 1383 Assistance Grant (due 2/1), Beverage Container Recycling City/County Payment Program (due 1/18), Farm and Ranch Solid Waste Cleanup and Abatement Grant (due 2/10).

9. COVID-19 GENERAL DISCUSION

The County has recommended teleworking for the next two weeks. The haulers have not reported any work stoppages due to the high transmission of the Omicron variant.

10. SB 1383 & AB 1826- ROLLOUT ROUNDTABLE

SB 1383 is in effect now. The city of La Mesa has had food scrap collection since April 2021. Chula Vista has rolled out AB 1826 oversight for commercial and multi-family complexes. San Diego is actively onboarding additional businesses in the organic recycling program at Miramar Landfill.

11. TARP YOUR LOAD/LITTER ABATEMENT – OPPORTUNITIES TO UNIFY OUTREACH - No report.

12. SUBCOMITTEES' REPORT

- **Household Hazardous Waste** CARB considering amending or discontinuing the deposit program on small containers of car air conditional refrigerant. An estimated 1 million containers are sold annually. A \$10 recycling fee is paid upfront and there is a 60% recovery rate. CARB is holding a workshop on this topic January 20, 2022.
