The San Diego County Water Authority and its **22 member agencies** serve 3.3 million people throughout the region's metropolitan area.

In San Diego County, runoff from your property is prohibited. **To help you prevent runoff and conserve water, each water district has resources for residents.** Even if you are on a well, you might still be eligible for some services.

The State of California has adopted permanent water restrictions to reduce unnecessary water consumption. The following are some of the State's current restrictions:

- Do not allow water from outdoor landscapes to run off from your property.
- When washing vehicles, an automatic shut-off nozzle is required.
- Do not apply water to driveways and sidewalks.
- For water fountains or other decorative water features, only those that recirculate water are allowed to contain water.
- Do not water landscapes during or within 48 hours after a measurable rainfall.

Each water district provides resources that can help you meet the State restrictions. The following resources are available on your water district's website:

watering restrictions

During periods of extended drought, the State of California may adopt additional mandatory water use restrictions. Check your water district's website for more details.
