Tips For A Healthy Lawn

- 1} **Check for broken and misaligned sprinklers after you mow.**
- 2} **Water your lawn in short cycles to allow water to absorb into the soil.**
- 3} **Water early in the morning or late in the evening when temperatures are cooler.**
- 4} **Learn how much water your lawn actually needs by observing an entire watering cycle or by consulting a free online watering calculator (see links below).**
