





## Apprenticeships



• For every dollar spent on apprenticeship, employers get an average of \$1.47 back in increased productivity (U.S. Department of Labor).



#### The Swiss

- In Switzerland, 70% of students choose apprenticeships; 30% remain with company or return after college
- Recruitment & career fairs start in 7th grade
- All have civics and business classes


