I. CALL TO ORDER/INTRODUCTIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

- A. Brian Covell, Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:30 am.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by Dr. Julie Phillips, seconded by Roxanne Rauto-Shin to approve the meeting minutes from September 12, 2024, October 10, 2024, November 14, 2024, and January 9, 2025. Motion carried.

III. PUBLIC COMMENTS/PETITIONS

There were no public comments or petitions.

- Health Services Capacity Plan Level: Plan Level 4 Enhanced Surveillance (Level 1-5 Five is Lowest)
 - Southern California Fire Preparedness Level: Plan Level 3 (Level 1-5 Five is highest)
- <u>Flu and System Strain:</u> The Flu Season is here and impacting the community. The EMS Office, together with Health Services Capacity Task Force sector representatives, is engaged in health system strain monitoring and mitigation actions. As a reminder, the "PHO Flu Order" is evergreen and is in force through the designated influenza season (November 1 March 31). The flu letter requires, among other things, that healthcare personnel (including EMS Credentialed Personnel) wear a mask in patient care areas if they choose not to be vaccinated for the flu.
- EMS System Redesign Process Update:

Following the completion of the Comprehensive Evaluation of the Base Hospital System and Trauma Catchment Reports, the EMS Office is working to bring together representative stakeholder groups to support this project. As a reminder, a question-and-answer feature and the final reports and timeline information are posted on the San Diego County Engage Page.

• Ambulance Diversion Town Hall Meeting Announcement:

Thank you to those who attended or participated in the Ambulance Diversion Town Hall meeting on January 31, 2025. We value the community's input regarding ambulance diversion practices and policies and look forward to identifying opportunities to improve our EMS delivery system. If you were unable to attend the town hall or have additional feedback to provide, please complete our online form. This form will remain open until February 14. Thank you for your collaboration and for providing valuable feedback.

• Ambulance Ordinance Update:

The ambulance ordinance is undergoing an update to better align with current best practices and medical transportation standards. As part of this process, we want to hear from the community to help better understand their experience with the EMS delivery system and identify areas for potential improvement.

A survey is open to all stakeholders, including prehospital professionals, hospital personnel, agency administrators, specialty care centers, and the public. The survey can be accessed on the <u>San Diego County Engage Page</u> and is open from December 31, 2024, to February 14, 2025.

New Requirement for Automated Cardiac Compression Devices on July 1, 2025:

As agencies were informed beginning in March of last year, protocol S-103 language was revised to state that automated cardiac compression devices will become mandatory for all ALS ground ambulances on July 1, 2025. This requirement was included in the educational materials distributed to all EMS agencies with the revised protocols on May 1, 2024.

We are providing early notification of this requirement in appreciation of its substantial fiscal impact and the need for inclusion in the budgeting process for the next fiscal year.

 Job Opportunities at County EMS: Juliet Sapida was introduced as the new EMS Quality Assurance Specialist.

The County is recruiting a temporary expert professional to support the EMS Corps program. These postings may be found on the County's job opening website.

- <u>EMT Renewals submit early!</u> In the spring of odd-numbered years (2025, 2027, etc.), the County EMS Credentialing Team is inundated with EMT renewal applications. The monthly credentialing average is about 300 applications, swelling to over 700 in March. Agencies are asked to work with their EMT staff to make sure their applications are submitted early to avoid the rush.
- <u>County EMS Fees and the next Fiscal Year:</u> The EMS Office is currently working closely with the County's Emergency Services Administration Unit to review LEMSA fees. In 2024, the Board of Supervisors supported a phased three-year increase for personnel, specialty care, and permitting fees.
