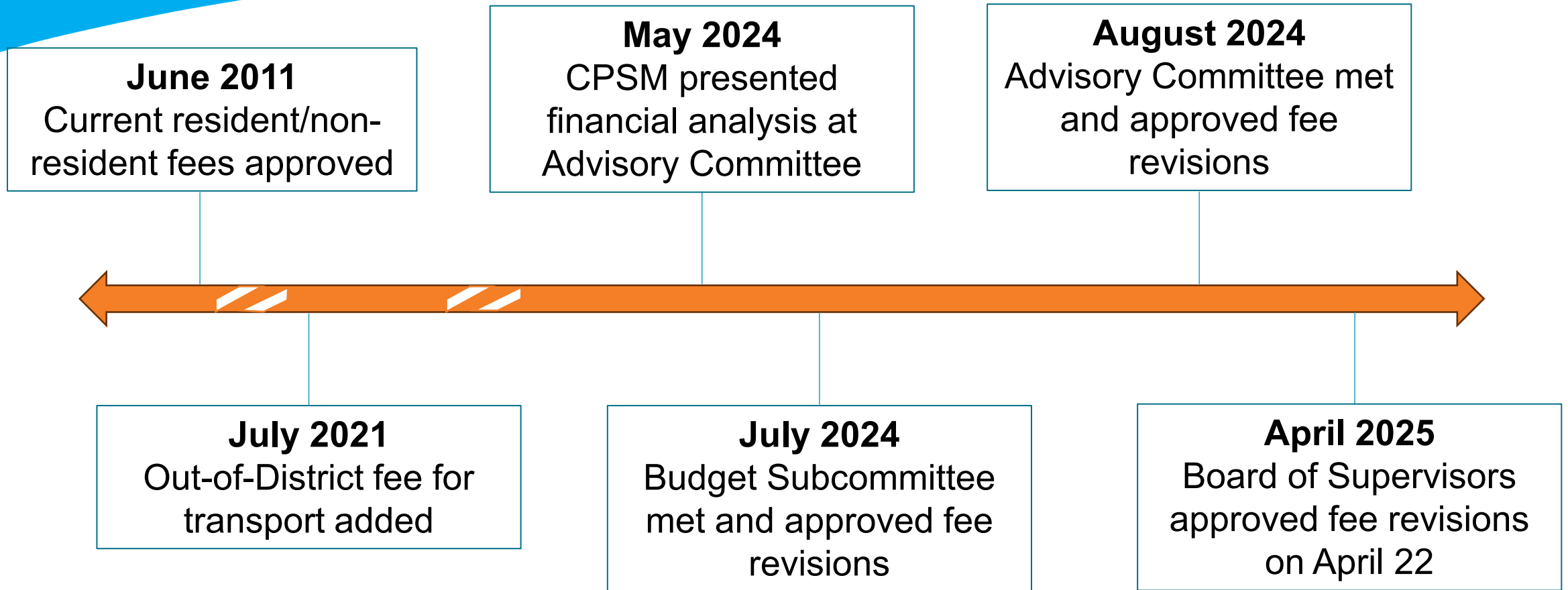

# Considerations

- There are no absolutes – every patient, patient transport and health plan is different
- Residents will continue to be responsible for any patient portion of bill as required by law
  - Coinsurance/Copay, deductibles
  - Residents will not be “balance billed”
- Non-residents will be responsible for any portion of the bill not covered/satisfied by coinsurance or deductible

Fee Type	Current Fee	Approved Fee	Fee Change	% Change
Ambulance Transport	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Resident: \$400</li><li>Non-Resident: \$1050</li><li>Out-of-District: \$2500</li></ul>	\$3,743	\$2,426	184%
Mileage	\$40	\$48	\$8	20%
Treat-No-Transport (TNT)	\$150	\$460	\$310	207%
Standby Hourly Rate	N/A	\$235	\$235	N/A



# Key Takeaways

- These new rates sunset the longstanding and underfunded resident subsidized rates.
- CSA-17 rates and fees will now align with the County FPD rates.
  - Based on the County average rates of all EMS providers.
- Billing inquiries should be directed to County EMS staff, not the CSA-17 Cities or the District.
- Fee schedule goes into effect on July 1, 2025.
