- Month to month approval from FEMA. Approved through May 7.
- COVID-19 Vaccine Update:
  - 2-1-1 San Diego is helping San Diegans of all ages who need assistance with scheduling COVID-19 vaccine appointments. Call 2-1-1 if you do not have access to a computer, need someone to assist you with scheduling an appointment, and/or homebound.
  - The County is working with fire departments to bring vaccination clinics ("mobile pods") to low-income housing communities to vaccinate semi-homebound individuals.
  - The CDC has released interim <u>Public Health Recommendations for</u> <u>Fully Vaccinated People</u>.
- c. Legislative Update:
  - The Adult Protective Services (APS) Manager, Kimberly Pearce, provided testimony to the APS Sponsorship bill on April 6 to allow APS to share information with code enforcement agencies for the purpose of addressing sub-standard care in independent living facilities.
  - The American Rescue Plan dedicates funding (allocation TBD) for Older Americans Act programs.
- d. Area Plan Ad Hoc Subcommittee: Joe Garbanzos, Chair
  - i. J. Garbanzos reported that the Subcommittee finds the process and content of the Area Plan fair and equitable. Recommends continued consultation, input, and monitoring of progress from the Advisory Council.

    - Main updates include: objectives updated to reflect current efforts, Service Unit Plan objectives reported for units of service provided for all funding sources, proposed units of service, targets, and actuals updated to reflect COVID-19 impact and limitations on in-person interaction or events, Advisory Council Membership reflects current membership and composition, and minimum percentage of Title III B program funds to meet the adequate proportion of funding for Priority Services.
