Adult Council Achievements and Goals Update April 10, 2023

Fiscal Year 2022-23 Achievement Highlights

Presentations

- EQRO Access to Care Recommendations
- Substance Use PIP Presentation
- County of San Diego Response to Fentanyl as a Public Health Crisis Presentation – Dr. Kattan

Healthcare and Racial Disparities

- Liz Miles presented on EQRO Access to Care Recommendations related to low penetration rates for specialty mental health services (SMHS) among Latino/Hispanic and Asian/Pacific Islander beneficiaries. The Council reviewed adult SMHS utilization data by region and race/ethnicity and discussed planned quality improvement activities.
- Deputy Director reported out on CCRT ongoing discussions on health care disparities and the upcoming BH Equity Index that UCSD is developing as a tool for the system of care for planning and design of program purposes.
- CCRT FY 22-23 Goals – 3 areas of focus update:
 1. Improvement Review of 3 LE Cultural Competence Plans for input and feedback
 2. Health Care Disparities - participate in Community Experience Partnership and review of Behavioral Health Equity Index and Dashboard
 3. Coordinating efforts/enhance cross-threading and membership.
- Elizabeth Bustos, Office of strategy and Innovation, did a presentation to the CCRT on Language Equity in Practice: The Translation, Language, Culture Connection Story.
- UCSD presented on two initiatives to increase access to and retention in MAT.
 - > The MAT EQRO PIP aims to increase the proportion of clients with OUD who are dual enrolled to receive MAT, as well as increasing the percentage of OUD pharmacotherapy treatment events for at least 180 days.
- The DHCS CalAIM BHQIP initiative aims to increase the percentage of clients receiving follow-up after an ED visit for an alcohol or other drug visit through improved data exchange and care coordination.

Behavioral Health Workforce

Adult Council representatives joined an ad hoc committee with other behavioral health coalitions to develop 29 recommendations to support increased workforce capacity. These recommendations were incorporated into the SDWP report entitled [Addressing San Diego's Behavioral Health Worker Shortage](#) and ultimately [adopted by the Board of Supervisors](#) on October 11.

Continuum of Care

- Deputy Director reported on the progress of several programs including:
 - > Mobile Outreach Response Team and the various stages of implementation, including 24/7 response across the County. Over 4,500 referrals through the ACL/988 and Law Enforcement have been responded to and planning is underway for School Districts and Colleges and Universities MCRT response.
 - > The Rosecrans Shelter opened in Fall of 2022, with 150 beds. This is a joint effort between County of San Diego and San Diego Housing Commission. Behavioral health support services are on site.
 - > CHRT Midway Shelter and the CHRT- Safe Haven opened in December 2022. These are dedicated services for homeless persons with a chronic substance condition who are resistant to services.
 - > Design and development are under way for a 7th CSU in El Cajon. Anticipated operations FY 24-25

- Dr. Jessica Kattan presented on the County of San Diego’s Response to Fentanyl as a Public Health Crisis, including population health data and local actions to address illicit fentanyl. Strategies include conducting overdose prevention education, expanding naloxone distribution, intervening early with individuals at highest risk for overdose, and improving detention of overdose outbreaks to facilitate more effective response.
