- I. Welcome and Introductions (Suzette Southfox)
- II. Approval of Minutes (Suzette Southfox)
  - November 13, 2017 meeting minutes approved.
- **III.** Business Items (Laura Vleugels, MD)
  - Lilac Fire Update
    - Due to the Lilac Fire, Dr. Vleugels provided meeting coverage on behalf of Yael Koenig. Ms. Koenig was supporting the County Disaster Operation Center (DOC). The Lilac Fire started on Thursday, December 7, 2017 and has burned approximately 4100 acres, including 151 structures. BHS is providing mental health crisis services to the fire victims.
  - Private Sector Sub-Committee update on feasibility of focusing on proposed topics
    - ✓ To assist with systems crossthreading for Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder (SUD)
      Discussion Summary:
      - The Private Sector requested more specific information from the Council regarding "crossthreading" mental health and SUD
      - Data is a challenge as Mental Health Data and SUD data are kept in different data systems
      - o ODS core values and principles should be in alignment with CYF values and principles
      - A Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) Organized Delivery System (ODS) presentation would benefit the Council members and meeting attendees and provide a clearer vision of how to operationalize "crossthreading"
    - ✓ Explore use of social media to promote Council's activities: This is not an area of focus for the Private Sector
    - ✓ How to better serve the Refugee population Discussion Summary:
      - o Past presentations were rich, but no actions were planned
      - The Education Sector data system does not identify refugee status. There is only internal "flagging"
      - Matters Involving Neuro-Disorders (MIND) is a community –driven, cross-sector consortium under the Nile Sisters Development Initiative that BHS (Adult System of Care) is already part of. Need to determine if CYF should join this group to optimize resources and avoid duplication of services. Will follow-up with disseminating meeting information to Council.
  - Educationally Related Mental Health Services (ERMHS) presentation update (Violeta Mora)
     The Education Sector is scheduled to meet in January 2018 to discuss the ERMHS presentation. The Council reiterated that the presentation should include the following items:





- ✓ Overview
- ✓ Context of the past and present (changes)
- ✓ Criteria for referrals
- ✓ How to move from level of services.
- Hepatitis A Status update

The outbreak within the county is at 567 cases, including 20 deaths reported. Vaccinations are available throughout the county.   - ✓ It was clarified that the current version: "San Diego youth are healthy, safe, successful in school, and in their transition to adulthood, while being law abiding, while living in a home and community that supports strong family connections" was developed to acknowledge all sectors partnerships.

### VII. Director's Report (Alfredo Aguirre)

- The California Behavioral Health Director's Association (CBHDA) developed an initiative called Behavioral Health 2020 as a tool to plan the future of County Behavioral Health in California. Some of the input provided at the last meeting include:
  - ✓ Integration of children and the adult mental health systems may work in small counties only
  - ✓ Criteria regarding mild to serious is different in children and adults

#### Challenges include:

- ✓ Growing demand of services
- ✓ Every county is different

#### Future discussions include:

- ✓ Panel discussions regarding underserved populations
- ✓ Trauma informed care for early childhood populations.
- Budget presentation to the BHAB

BHS staff provided a budget presentation to the BHAB on December 7, 2017. It includes the Fiscal Year 2017-18 HHSA and BHS adopted budget, five year forecast priorities, and budget timeline and key dates. Priorities include, but are not limited to DMC-ODS, Long Term Care, No Place Like Home, Project One For ALL (POFA), Continuum of Care Reform (CCR), Electronic Health Record and improvements to the San Diego County Psychiatric Hospital.   - ✓ In recognition of this new system, the County is considering holding off on billing activities to prevent disallowances.
