• Ten Year Roadmap update

The input and feedback received is being integrated to the Ten Year Roadmap document. The updated document will be distributed as soon as updates are completed.

IV. Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) (Martin Dare)

MHSA Innovations

Innovations 18 is a CYF Perinatal project in collaboration with the Public Health Nurses Home Visiting Programs. This project is expected to be presented for approval to the Mental Health Services Oversight and Accountability Commission (MHSOAC) within the first quarter of 2018. The proposed program intends to support parents who have perinatal mood and anxiety disorders and provide treatment services and linkages to appropriate resources and care. The proposal was initiated due to CYF Council highlighting the need for increased screening, treatment and linkage to services for perinatal behavioral health issues.

V. Sectors "Hot Topics"

Public Input/Discussion (Yael Koenig) (Handout)

• CYF System of Care Principles

The latest draft of the CYF System of Care Principles was provided and each principle was discussed. A new draft was created at the meeting (Amanda Lance-Sexton). Summary of the input provided:

1. **Collaboration of 4 sectors**. Approved as follows:

Coordination and shared responsibility between child/youth/family, public agencies, private organizations, and education.





- 2. **Integrated:** New proposed language: Services are comprehensive, accessible, efficient, coordinate behavioral and physical health care, provide seamless transition of care and utilize natural community supports.
- 3. **Child, youth and Family Driven:** Approved as follows: Child, youth, and family voice, choice, and lived experience are sought, valued and prioritized in service delivery, program design and policy development.
- 4. **Individualized:** Approved as follows: Services and supports are customized to fit the unique strengths and needs of children, youth and families.
- 5. **Strength-based:** Approved as follows: Services and supports identify and utilize knowledge, skills, and assets of children, youth, families and their community.
- 6. **Community-based:** Approved as follows: Services are accessible to children, youth and families and strengthen their connections to natural supports and local resources.
- 7. **Outcome-driven:** Approved as follows: Outcomes are measured and evaluated to monitor progress and to improve services and satisfaction.
- 8. **Culturally Competent "Culturally Responsive":** To be sent to the Cultural Competence Resource Team (CCRT) for input and feedback.
- 9. **Trauma-Informed:** Once the Council completes their final recommendations, will consult at agency level to ensure for language consistency.
- 10. **Persistence:** It was recommended that this principle could be part of the document introduction.

Next steps

The draft revised at the meeting will be sent to the CYF System of Care Principles Ad-Hoc Subcommittee and to Sharon Whitehurst-Payne for additional review. The new draft will be discussed at the February 12, 2018 meeting. Upon Council vote, the final document will be provided to the BHS Director for final approval and adoption.

VIII. Director's Report (Alfredo Aguirre) Federal Level

- Congress extended the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) for three months. Limited impact on the existing children's mental health programs, but will impact general health programs.
- The Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) is scheduled to expire in March 2018 and will impact TAY individuals and TAY parents.





• The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) announced the termination of the Temporary Protection Status (TPS) for El Salvadorian refugees on January 8, 2018. The temporary immigration status had originally been granted to refugees of the El Salvador earthquake in 2001. A delayed termination period of 18 months ending on September 9, 2019 will allow refugees to seek alternative lawful immigration status in the United States. There are approximately 200,000 El Salvador natives that may be impacted by the termination of TPS. The majority of these individuals live in the Los Angeles and Bay areas since 2001.

State Level

- State Budget
 - ✓ The Governor's budget is expected to be released on January 10, 2018. It is not expected that the BHS budget would be affected by the State budget.

Local Level

- DMC-ODS
 - ✓ The State has approved the County of San Diego's interim rates on the new Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (ODS).
 - ✓ BHS SUD providers that are DMC certified, or with a submitted DMC certification application to the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) as of March 1, 2018, will be eligible for "Start-Up" funds in Fiscal Year 2017-18.
 - ✓ A presentation for final approval to the Board of Supervisors is scheduled for March 13, 2018.
