

Dual Capable and Dual Enhanced Definitions

Dual Capable Program Criteria

Dual Capable programs shall meet the following criteria:

- San Diego Comprehensive Continuous System of Care (CCISC) Consensus Document adoption and implementation
- Completion of one (1) COMPASS¹
- Development & completion of one (1) CCISC Action Plan derived from the results of the COMPASS. A minimum of 75% of the action items shall be completed within 12 months.
- Completion of second COMPASS to demonstrate improvement in scores, or, administration of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration Dual Diagnosis Capability in Mental Health Treatment (SAMHSA DDCMHT) or Dual Diagnosis Capability in Addiction Treatment (DDCAT) Fidelity Scale and achieve and maintain a score range of 3.0-4.49²
- Have Program Policies that include:
 - Welcoming policy/statement
 - Dual assessment, treatment, and discharge planning
 - Adhere to CCISC practices as indicated in the Organizational Providers Operations Handbook (OPOH).
 - Integrated Co-Occurring Disorder/Comprehensive Continuous System of Care (COD/CCISC) model staff training and supervision.
- Complete the CCISC Annual Program Report
- Complete COMPASS or Fidelity Scale annually thereafter maintaining a score range of 3.0-4.49 along with an action plan if indicated.

¹ COMPASS tool should be relevant to specific program type (i.e. COMPASS EZ, COMPASS Prevention) and be most current version.

² SAMHSA Fidelity Scales shall be administered according to County guidelines

Dual Enhanced Program Criteria

Dual Enhanced programs shall meet the following criteria:

- Maintain Dual Capable criteria (excluding COMPASS Administration)
- Administration of SAMHSA DDCMHT or DDCAT Fidelity Scales and achieve a score of 4.5 or greater every two (2) years.

Guidelines for SAMHSA DDC & DDE Fidelity Scales

1. Utilize a team of CADRE approved “Fidelity Testers” (Team) in SD County. Team members shall be CADRE trained County or Contractor employees with training and experience administering the Fidelity Scales.
2. Team members shall be oriented and trained to the Fidelity Scales by CADRE members.
3. Team establishes consensus on how to administer, interpret, and score Fidelity Scales.
4. CADRE Executive Committee agreed to use N/A for non-applicable items and extract those items from the scoring process on all fidelity scales.
5. Programs shall be tested by external team members unless agency has separate QI/QM mechanism to oversee programs along with “internal fidelity tester”. Agency Fidelity Tester(s) shall still meet criteria 1-3.
6. If agency has “internal fidelity tester”, report shall be reviewed by an external fidelity tester via the CADRE team
7. Testers can be contacted via the CADRE website
8. Final report with scoring shall be submitted to COR
