

Key Findings

Homeless (16% n=6,091)

- Homeless adults were nearly twice as likely to receive emergency services than the AOABHS systemwide average.
- Homeless adults were more likely than the AOABHS systemwide averages to be male, Hispanic, and diagnosed with Schizophrenia and Other Psychotic Disorder.
- Seventy-nine percent of homeless adults were reported to have a cooccurring disorder, as compared to 53% in the AOABHS systemwide average.
- Over the past three years, the percentage of Hispanic adults who are homeless decreased, and the percentage of White adults who are homeless increased.

LGBTQ (6% n=2,576)

- LGBTQ adults were more likely to be female, between the ages of less than 18 and 25 years old, and diagnosed with Bipolar Disorder
- Nearly three-fourths of LGBTQ adults are on Medi-cal only insurance. Over the past three years, LGBTQ adults with no insurance or unknown insurance have decreased by six percentage points.

than the AOABHS systemwide average.

- Eighty-five percent of LGBTQ adults were reported to have a history of trauma, as compared to 36% in the AOABHS systemwide average.
- Over the past three years, endorsement of the sexual orientation response option "bisexual" has been the highest endorsed by LGBTQ adults.

Justice System (42% n=17,715)

- Adults who have been involved with the justice system were more likely to be male, and between the ages of 26 and 59 years old when compared to the AOABHS systemwide average.
- These adults were more likely to be diagnosed with Schizophrenia and Other Psychotic Disorder than the AOABHS systemwide average.
- The number of adults who have been involved with the justice system increased by 7% compared with FY 2019-20 (16,512 to 17,715)
- Over the past three years, the percentage of Hispanic adults who have been involved with the justice system decreased, and the percentage of these White adults have increased.

AOA N = 42,614

Military (4% n=1,824)

- Adults who reported that they had served in the military were more likely to be male, between the ages of 26 and 59, and diagnosed with Schizophrenia and Other Psychotic Disorder.
- Adults who reported that they had served in the military were more likely to be homeless compare to the AOABHS systemwide averages.
- These adults were more likely to report an employment status of "not in the labor force" than the AOABHS systemwide average. However, over the past three years, these adults who have reported an employment status of "not in the labor force" has decreased.
- Over the past three years, the percentage of these adults have increased for those in the age group of less than 18 to 25 and for those who identify as female.




