Drug Medi-Cal

Homeless (28% n=3,676)

- Of the 13,173 clients served during FY 2020-21 in the DMC-ODS 28% were homeless, compared to 32% served during FY 2019-20.
- Over the past three fiscal years, homeless clients served by the DMC-ODS diagnosed with a mental health disorder in addition to a substance use disorder has increased from 44% in FY 2018-19 to 53% in FY 2020-21.
- In FY 2020-21, 53% of homeless clients were diagnosed with a mental health disorder in addition to a substance use disorder, compared to 39% in the overall DMC-ODS.
- Homeless clients served by the DMC-ODS during FY 2020-21 were more than twice as likely (41%) to receive services from a residential program compared to all clients (16%) served by the DMC-ODS during the fiscal year.
- Homeless clients served by the DMC-ODS were more likely to report having a primary drug of choice of methamphetamine (38%) and alcohol (26%), compared to all clients served by the DMC-ODS (26% and 19% respectively).

LGBTQ+ (1% n=121)

- Of the 13,173 clients served during FY 2020-21 in the DMC-ODS, 121 (1%) were LGBTQ+ clients. Due to unknown sexual orientation and gender identities of many clients in the DMC-ODS the findings presented here should be interpreted with caution.
- During FY 2020-21, more than two-thirds (69%) of LGBTQ+ clients were diagnosed with a mental health disorder in addition to a substance use disorder, compared to 39% in the overall DMC-ODS.
- About half (51%) of LGBTQ+ clients served by the DMC-ODS during FY 2020-21 reported a primary drug of choice of methamphetamine at admission, compared to 26% in the overall DMC-ODS.
- LGBTQ+ clients served by the DMC-ODS during FY 2020-21 were more likely to receive services from outpatient (37%) or intensive outpatient (37%) programs compared to all clients served by the DMC-ODS (23% and 20% respectively).

DMC N = 13,173

Justice System (43% n=5,608)

- Of the 5,608 justice system clients served by the DMC-ODS during FY 2020-21, 21% are AB109 clients.
- The proportion of justice system clients served by the DMC-ODS has decreased from 48% in FY 2019-20 to 43% in FY 2020-21.
- Of the justice system clients served by the DMC-ODS during FY2020-21, 41% were diagnosed with a mental health disorder in addition to a substance use disorder, compared to 39% in the overall DMC-ODS.
- Justice system clients were more likely to receive services from outpatient (31%) and intensive outpatient (28%) and less likely to utilize OTP (7%) programs compared to all clients served by the DMC-ODS (23%, 20% and 31% respectively).
- Forty percent of justice system clients served by the DMC-ODS during FY 2020-21 reported a primary drug of choice of methamphetamine at admission, compared to 26% in the overall DMC-ODS.

Military (3% n=437)

- Of the 13,173 clients served during FY 2020-21 in the DMC-ODS, 437 (3%) were military clients.
- Military clients served by the DMC-ODS during FY 2020-21 reported the most common primary drug of choice of methamphetamine and alcohol, compared to the most common drug of choice for all clients served by the DMC-ODS of heroin and methamphetamine.
- Over the past three fiscal years, military clients served by the DMC-ODS with reported living arrangements in dependent living has increased (from 18% in FY 2018-19 to 27% in FY 2020-21) and homeless has decreased (from 50% in FY 2018-19 to 37% in FY 2020-21).
- During FY 2020-21, military clients served in the DMC-ODS were more likely to receive services from residential (27%) programs compared to all clients served in the DMC-ODS (16%).
- Of the military clients served in the DMC-ODS 57% were diagnosed with a mental health disorder in addition to a substance use disorder, compared to 39% in the overall DMC-ODS.

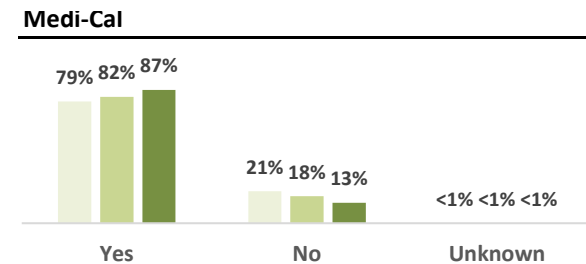
