# LIVE WELL SAN DIEGO AREAS OF INFLUENCE: Q3 FY 2024-25

Social determinants of health are conditions within environments where people live, learn, work, and play that affect a range of health outcomes and impact risks. Live Well San Diego (LWSD) is the vision of the County to work towards improving the social determinants of health for San Diego County residents. The 5 Areas of Influence are the ways the County's vision of health, safety, and thriving residents are measured across a person's lifespan.


Progress on the LWSD Areas of Influence was measured for adults who received a follow-up assessment during Q3 and an intake or previous assessment completed within the prior four to eight months. The Recovery Markers Questionnaire (RMQ) assessment was chosen to represent San Diego's Areas of Influence because it measures a client's perspective on their own recovery on a 1-5 score range with 5 representing the highest level

of recovery.










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
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


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# **Level of Care (n = 821)**
