Champion for Health – COVID19 presentation (Andrew Gonzalez)	 Andrew Gonzalez gave an update on COVID-19 information as of May 5th, 2020: New symptoms: fever, chills, headache, new loss of taste or smell, and muscle pain Three new testing sites located in El Cajon, Chula Vista, and Escondido Doctor referral not required Schedule appointment by phone, online, or through 211 referral Higher risk populations: Older adults, particularly those in nursing homes and long-term care facilities Individuals with chronic illness or compromised immune system If experiencing at least two of the symptoms of COVID-19: Option A: Contact health care provider to get tested Option B: If unable to get tested with health care provider, contact 211 for the "Drive Thru Testing Nurse Scheduler" As recreational areas begin to reopen, all are required to continue following public health guidance Face masks not recommended for children under two years old, as it may obstruct breathing. Refer to CDC website for proper materials and instruction for creating face masks at home
