COVID-19 Melissa Gaines, RN Lucile Packard Children's Hospital Stanford 11:50-12:20pm	 The COVID-19 situation is rapidly changing, the information provided is accurate as of March 31, 2020 Coronavirus is a type of common virus that can infect your nose, sinuses, or upper throat Symptoms include runny nose, headache, cough, sore throat, fever, or a general feeling of being unwell On February 11, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) announced COVID-19 as the official name of the disease On March 11, 2020, the WHO designated the COVID-19 outbreak as a pandemic Person-to-person spread is believed to be the main way the virus is spreading Contact with infected surfaces or objects may also spread the virus High risk groups include: Older adults, people who have serious chronic medical conditions, and individuals with a compromised immune system Social distancing is the practice recommended by public health officials to stop or slow down the spread of a contagious disease The San Diego County Public Health Officer has issued orders and emergency regulations in response to the COVID-19 situation in San Diego County
