III. Public Input	 Mary Jo O'Brien expressed her concerns regarding client transition from mild to moderate programs/clinics. Mrs. O'Brien informed that clients that are directed to a walk-in clinic & are asked to wait long periods of time, generally do not stay, jeopardizing their mental state. Mrs. O'Brien stated that the referral health plan process is not working for clients & suggested for a warm-hand off between plans and clinics. 	
IV. Director's Update (Alfredo Aguirre)	 State: The state has started evaluating & identifying options for counties' roles in the delivery of care, as several federal Medicaid waivers & State Plan Amendments are due to expire in 2020. This includes the 1915(b) waiver and the CA Medi-Cal 2020 Demonstration/1115 waiver, which umbrellas the DMC-ODS & Whole Person Care Pilot. In addition, the state continues to review the gaps within the Continuum of Care and prioritizing areas of needs. 	
V. Resident Leadership Academy (Dana Richardson - Community Health Improvement Partners)	 Dana Richardson, Vice President with Community Health Improvement Partners provided an overview of the Resident Leadership Academy (RLA). The RLA is a curriculum-based, public health leadership program that empowers residents from underserved & under resourced communities to make positive changes in their neighborhoods. RLA Council meetings are bi-monthly and are held across all 6 regions of San Diego County.
