**VI. Supported Employment Data Presentation**

Vicki Brannock)

- Vicki Brannock with San Diego Workforce Partnership (SDWP) provided a presentation on Supported Employment Data.
- SDWP was contracted to provide BHS Supportive Employment consulting services, which was essential in creating the Five-Year Strategic Employment Plan.
- The Strategic Plan was developed in collaboration with consumers, County staff, and community stakeholders to identify effective goals to increase employment opportunities for individuals with SMI. The plan will be reviewed annually through data collection, analysis and reporting.

Overview of identified goals:

1. Increase opportunities for employment, income, length of employment and job retention for people with the lived experience of mental illness as an outcome.
2. Increase awareness of mental illness and address related stigma within the workplace and community.
3. Increase and develop relationships with employers, businesses, and the entrepreneurial sector
4. Identify and increase funding opportunities for employment, business, social enterprise related initiatives and programs for people with lived experience of mental illness
5. Streamline navigation systems for people with serious mental illness regarding employment and supportive services
6. Improve data collection, analysis and reporting capacity of service providers regarding increased employment for people with lived experience of mental illness

Efforts have made an impact on the outcomes since implementation resulting in the following:

- Two percent (2%) increase in clients being competitively employed since FY 14-15 out of 43,780 total clients in the system of care.
- One percent (1%) increase in clients seeking work in FY 15-16 out of 42,805 total clients in the system of care.
- Two percent (2%) decrease in clients not in labor force since FY 14-15.
