Director's Report (Alfredo Aguirre)	 Alfredo provided a brief summary to the council for the "No Place Like Home" Initiative, in which the Senate proposes to repurpose Proposition 63 (The Mental Health Services Act) bond money and creatively leverage billions of additional dollars from other local states, and federal funding. The County has concerns and questions about this bill, while recognizing the importance of supporting student mental health and wellness: Takes away local control and discretion of MHSA funded informed by our local communities and approved by our BOS and gives it to Statewide entity Establishes a precedent of legislatively creating new categories to earmark MHSA Unclear what type of services will be targeted; concern that programming may mirror what Campus Health offices already offer (note: the community college system is not as resourced in their health offices compared to CSU and UC systems) as opposed to crisis support services that connects students to resources in the community CSU and UC systems have out of state and foreign students so MHSA is designed to meet the needs of California residents, serving a broader population goes beyond the intent of the Act.
