Disparities Report Presentation (Steven Tally/UCSD & Brandon Carlisle/CASRC)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Steve & Brandon presented the Progress Towards Reducing Disparities triennial report for the (FY) 2009 – 2010, 2012 – 2013, 2015 – 2016, which describes the progress towards the reduction of disparities across age & racial/ethnic groups. The report assesses age and racial/ethnic group disparities in services utilization, engagement, type of services used, and diagnosis. <p>Key finding for AOA by age:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> TAY clients had a lower long-term engagement rates among AOA age groups. TAY clients were more likely than other age groups to use inpatient/emergency services or only jail services. Clients ages 26 to 59 had higher retention rates than both TAY and OA client. Penetration rates for outpatient services decreased for clients ages 26-59 but increased for TAY and OA clients. <p>Key findings for CYF:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Children age 5 and younger were more likely to receive only one session, compared to clients ages 6 and older. The proportion of clients age 6 – 11 that received 13 or more sessions decreased since FY 09-10. 	<p>Action Item:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> o Maria to email complete Progress Towards Reducing Disparities report.
