Other	<ul> <li>In light of the tragedy that occurred in El Cajon on September 27, 2016, Juan Camarena inquired about the role CCRT may have to examine and possibly provide recommendations for P.E.R.T curriculum.</li> <li>Elisa mentioned how vital the Cultural Competence Component is for Mental Health trainings and should be in the P.E.R.T curriculum if not already included.</li> <li>Celeste Hunter noted as a member of the P.E.R.T Advisory Committee, that immediately after the incident a meeting was held to address the needs and GAPs to improve services. The committee is in the beginning stages of overview. One of the concerns of members not only from the committee but from the community is law enforcement outside of P.E.R.T, what is there training in Cultural Competence.</li> <li>A recommendation to reach-out to Commanding Officers and their community relations staff within the regions to establish a working relation and help them understand the patient population that programs work with.
