Chair's Report (Piedad Garcia)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> BHS Community Engagement forums have commenced to allow community members to share their opinions and recommendations regarding the variety of behavioral health programs and services. Project One for All (P.O.F.A.), is a comprehensive strategy to ensure individuals with serious mental illness have access to treatment services paired with permanent supportive housing. The P.O.F.A implementation plan has some components to accomplish the goal: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Outreach and Engagement – Establish active outreach to homeless individuals to engage them in housing and services. ➤ Treatment Services – expansion of FSP/ACT wraparound treatment services that are easily accessible to improve individuals ability to function and sustain housing. ➤ Housing Resources – Identify and prioritize housing resources with a collective approach and commitment from housing authorities, local cities, providers and stakeholders. ➤ Outcomes – track progress and effectiveness at the individual and system to provide feedback for adjustments. 	
IV. QI Updates (Tabatha Lang)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The CC-PAS survey data has been compiled and result were distributed for CCRT to review. The results showed a decrease in technical assistance requests, furthermore the portion of the clinical program managers who indicated that they have met the standard has decreased for all but 2 standards. Programs are encouraged to continue enhancing knowledge of tools, resources and trainings. CBMCS survey data was also compiles and distributed. Based on the results the most self-identify training needs amongst staff were in the area of Awareness of Cultural Barriers and Socio-Cultural Diversities.
