iii. **Directors' Report – Alfredo Aguirre & Dr. Luke Bergmann**

A. Introduction to Dr. Luke Bergmann as the new incoming BHS Director when Alfredo retires in March. Luke was the former Integrative Services Director. Dr. Bergmann spoke about his background and vision.

B. **Updates (Alfredo):**

- **SB1045:** Pilot expansion to County approach to conservatorships. SD County is the third pilot County along with LA and San Francisco. Pilot Counties are being tasked to measure if there is a need to opt into SB1045 pilot. Effort is currently being led by Mark Sellers from OBI. Currently the data shows only 10 cases, however, there is likely many more due to non-Medi-Cal population.
 - Ask hospitals for feedback - how we can contribute internally to count the clients in need or who qualify?
 - Judith to be point person for the collection of this data from hospitals. Interested hospitals to send her an email.
- **Medi-Cal 2020:** Importance of a regional approach.

iv. **Board Conference Debrief**

- A. Chairwoman Gaspar is expecting action and long range planning.
- B. Outcome metrics will be needed to produce genuine results.
- C. One of the takeaways from the conference: it is more than the number of acute beds in our county. Framing experience for the community.
- D. Advising consultant to be chosen to guide and organize BHS process. Consultant will be chosen from a list vetted/certified by the County or a RFP.
- E. Alfredo spoke about some short term solutions being put in place:
 - a. Crisis response: reestablishing capacity for crisis stabilization in North Coastal area – working with Exodus and Tri-City Med Center to expand. Working with Palomar to canvas other possible enhancements in North Inland area.

- b. Long Term Care: rolling out 67 long term care beds in Crestwood, which should be ready by mid-December. Hummingbird will also have an additional 16 beds. 40 SNF beds will also be available in Lakeside, pending licensure.
