1. Welcome/Introductions/ Announcements- Nicole Loebach, Chair Elect	Participants introduced themselves.
2. Public Comments	To move the meeting to 4 th Wed of the month at 10am.
3. Review and approval of Agenda and Minutes	March 2017 minutes were approved after a clarification on the new re-classed/ retitled position for AIS Director retitled to Director, Aging and Adult Services.
4. BHS Director Alfredo Aguirre	Not in attendance.
5. Chair Report – Nicole Loebach, Chair Elect	The work group works on a report about the strategic goals and will do a presentation at the Older Adult Council.
6. Older Adult SOC Update – Piedad Garcia	Not in attendance. Connie provided a brief update. BHS will be presenting the extension and expansion of the 3 years INN projects before end of year. Final annual evaluation report, for CREST, is pending completion.
7. MHSA update - Adrienne Yancey	Martin Dare on behalf of Adrienne Yancey. 3 years plan for MHSA will be ready by June 30, 2017 and will be open for public comments the entire month of July 2017. Community engagement forums will be happening in the month of August 2017. Next week three new proposals will be presented in Sacramento. Currently the State suspended all new proposals until they decide how they want to receive these proposals. New rules are coming in place at the end of the month and it's unclear at the moment how to define what innovation means.
8. QI Update – Dasha Dahdouh	3 page Data report was distributed with the summary from the last 2 quarters (some reports were from 2 nd Qtr and some from 3 rd Qtr). <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The overall number of older adult clients receiving OABHS services in Q2 of FY 2016-17 increased by 6.1% from the previous quarter.• The Level of Care utilized most frequently by the OA clients was the Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) level of care

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	<p>(4,258 total visits among 305 clients). In contrast, services at the Outpatient types of programs were received by the most number of clients in Q2, FY 2016-17 (4,778 total visits among 1,363 clients). The overall utilization stays relatively consistent quarter after quarter.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For Inpatient and Outpatient Psychiatric clinics the 30-day readmission rate at Fee-for-Service (FFS) hospitals among older Medi-Cal adults was at its three-year lowest (7.9%) in March, 2017. There were only 3 readmissions in March, 2017. • So far in FY 2016-17, there have been 6 readmissions to the San Diego County Psychiatric Hospital (SDCPH) among older adults. • The trend of readmission rates in FY 2016-17 has been similar to FY 2015-16, with September having the highest readmission rate among older adults. There was only 1 readmission in Q3 of FY 2016-17. <p>There was a request to develop report for hospitals only.</p> <p>BHS is in the 3rd day of the 5 days State survey.</p>
9. Announcements/ Public Comments	<p>Suggestions for future presentations: To invite speakers from Public Guardian, Public Administrator, Supporting housing Commission, St. Paul's PACE program, San Ysidro PACE program.</p> <p>CREST is taking referrals. They are updating e-mail distribution list for all zip codes they are servicing as well as logging in referrals coming from outside service zip codes.</p> <p>CREST is doing a lot of in-service presentations. They are happy to come by and make a presentation at staff meetings by request.</p> <p>Flyer is coming out for a full day training on hoarding on June 6th.</p> <p>OAC retreat is coming up in December and the executive committee will start the planning process.</p> <p>June 2nd is Vital Aging conference.</p>
