High number of TAY clients who after IP discharge, did not receive services within 30 days (page 10). The Council would like pregnant/parenting data to be captured. Looking at the causes of exponential growth of dual diagnosis at age 18 and up (page 4). Demographics needs to be expanded. For example, why is transgender listed under sexual orientation? Not inclusive of East African or African population. It was discussed that much of this information is collected during initial assessment, and TAY may not feel comfortable being truthful. It is important to make them feel comfortable and safe. Forms were distributed to attendees. Forms were distributed to attendees.
