

Augmented Services Program (ASP)


- The goal of the ASP is to enhance and improve client functioning through augmentation of basic Board & Care (B&C) services to eligible individuals living in county-contracted B&Cs
- Of the 582 total ASP service slots, 348 are BHBH funded and 234 are MHSA funded

Transitional Rent

- Goes live January 1, 2026New benefit under Behavioral Health Community-Based Organized Networks of Equitable Care and Treatment (BH-CONNECT)
- Available up to six months for eligible Medi-Cal members through Managed Care Plans (MCPs)
- Serves as a bridge to permanent housing

Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA) Housing Interventions

- Goes live July 1, 2026.
- Provided in conjunction with Transitional Rent
- Available from months 7 through 12 via county behavioral health agencies for clients meeting criteria



Transitional Rent Service Design








Flexible Housing Pool (Flex Pool) Model







Flexible Housing Pool





A model for centrally administering rental assistance and coordinating related housing supports in a way that promotes stable long-term housing through four core functions:



Coordinates and combines funding streams, facilitating compliance and required reporting



Acts as a single fiscal intermediary between funders and landlords



Identifies, secures, and supports a portfolio of rental units



Coordinates with providers of housing supportive services

Phase 3: Develop Long-term Strategy

- Flex Pools Planning Grant
 - Received \$125,000 through Planning Grant
 - Supports planning efforts for the development, formation, and sustainability of flex pools
- Flex Pools Technical Assistance Academy
 - One of 13 counties accepted to Technical Assistance Academy
 - Tailored consulting over 18-month period
