

WHAT IS BHS' ROLE?





County Behavioral Health departments provide specialty mental health and substance use services to people who are eligible and enrolled in Medi-Cal.

BHS administers an integrated Behavioral Health Plan (BHP), which includes:

- Mental Health Plan (MHP)
- Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS) Plan

Mental Health Substance Use

Network adequacy is <u>required</u> to ensure people have timely access to care.

ROLE OF THE MANAGED CARE PLANS



Medi-Cal members receive **physical care services**, **Enhanced Care Management (ECM)**, and **Community Supports (CS)**, through the Managed Care Plans (MCPs).

MCPs also are responsible for covering <u>non-specialty mental</u> <u>health services</u> (mild to moderate)

BHS NETWORK OF CARE





Mental Health and Substance Use Services

- Provided through a network of County-operated and contracted providers
- Includes small, medium, and large community-based organizations that are diverse and geographically dispersed across our region.



Currently, there are 145 providers



Over 365 contracts



~ 200 contracts that are Medi-Cal reimbursable

Services are awarded through a formal procurement process based on the County's Administrative Code 401.

WHAT IS PROCUREMENT?





Procurement is the process of acquiring goods, services or work from an external source.



Important goals for County procurements include:

- 1. Fair and open competition
- 2. Best value* to the organization
- 3. Minimize risk

*Value is not limited to cost. It can include quality, quantity, time and other factors.

STEP 1: PLANNING



ACTIVITIES DONE PRIOR TO POSTING A SOLICITATION

Authority

 Do we have legal authority to procure for goods or services?

Needs Assessment

- What does the data show?
- What feedback have we gotten from stakeholders?
- What is an appropriate term?

Cost/Price Analysis

- What might the services cost in the region?
- Do we have enough funding to cover the cost?

CLOSER LOOK – AUTHORITY





COUNTY ADMIN CODE SECTION 401 – PROCUREMENT

Sets parameters in which the Director of Dept. of Purchasing and Contracting can enter into contracts without obtaining the Board of Supervisors approval, including:



Example: BHS issued a competitive solicitation for Substance Use Disorder Media Advocacy training, which had an annual total value of \$146,000 and did not require prior Board Authority to procure.



Example: BHS contracted with the California Mental Health Services Authority (CalMHSA) to access their agreement with Streamline Healthcare Solutions for access to the Semi-Statewide Electronic Health Record (SmartCare).

CLOSER LOOK – AUTHORITY





COUNTY ADMIN CODE SECTION 401 – PROCUREMENT (CONT.)

COMPETITIVE

Example: BHS intends to procure Adult Drug Court and Re-entry Court outpatient treatment services, which will total over \$1M annually and must have Board Authority prior to issuing the procurement.

SINGLE SOURCE

Example: BHS wants
to enter into a Single
Source contract with
ELLKAY Information
System to provide data
storage
services. Because they
contract will total over
\$100K annually, the
Board must authorize this
contract.

EXTENSIONS AND AMENDMENTS

Example: BHS needs to extend its contract for Mobile Crisis Response Team in the North Region by an additional year from original authorized term, to align with the procurement of all MCRT regions.

CLOSER LOOK – CONTRACT TERMS





1+4 option years

 The standard County term, which balances the benefit of continuity of services with the ability to test the market for providers that can offer more value to the County

Non-standard option years

- Short-term funding that will only support a contract for a specified number of years
- Capital projects that might necessitate a longer contract timeline, to account for zoning, licensing, construction, etc. before services can start

Contract extensions

 Could be necessary in different scenarios, like changes in funding, regulations or other outside factors not known at the time of procurement

STEP 3: AWARD





EVALUATING AND AWARDING CONTRACT

Source Selection Committee

- Screened for conflicts of interest, expertise and diversity
- Confidential to avoid outside influence
- Reviews proposals against established evaluation criteria

Notice of Intent to Award

- Posted to BuyNet following recommendation of SSC and approval of the Source Selection Authority
- Protest period of 5 days follows

Negotiations

 Finalizing terms of the contract between County and the offeror Contract Executed

CONTRACT & SERVICE MONITORING





Contracting Officer Representative (COR) Responsibilities

- Perform an annual risk assessment to determine the risk level of the contract
- Develop an annual monitoring plan in alignment to the assigned risk level
- Ensure all costs invoiced to the County are reasonable, allowable and appropriately categorized
- Ensure all contract requirements, including service levels, are met
- Address any concerns with the contractor timely

OUTCOMES SHIFTING FOCUS: FROM PROGRAMS TO PEOPLE

What We Are Moving Away From

- Contract-specific metrics
- Overly prescriptive monitoring
- Fragmented network evaluation approach



What We Are Moving Towards

- Network performance as a whole
 - ➤ Quality benchmarks (e.g., HEDIS)
 - ➤BHSA statewide behavioral health goals
 - ➤ Network adequacy
