I. CALL TO ORDER

The Behavioral Health Advisory Board (BHAB) was called to order by Chair Amanda Berry at 1:14 p.m. in person.

II. NON-AGENDA PUBLIC COMMENT

III. RECAP OF 2026 ACHIEVEMENTS AND UPCOMING PRIORITIES

Amanda Berry, Chair, provided the following recap:

- Departmental developments, including:
 - The appointment of Nadia Privara Brahms as Director of BHS.
 - Transitioning from Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) to Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA) the beginning on this Fiscal Year (FY) 2026-2027.
 - The establishment of BHS as a standalone County department effective July 1, 2026.
- Highlighted BHAB’s 2026 accomplishments, including:

- Formation of subcommittees
 - Development of quarterly report updates
 - Recommendations for the FY 2026–2027 budget
 - Contributions to the BHSA Integrated Plan
 - Continued advocacy for investments across the crisis continuum, youth services, and community-based alternatives.
- Provided an update on Board member participation to the following engagements:
 - BHS Peer Support Symposium
 - Public comment participation and community feedback processes
- Reported on subcommittee activities, including youth continuum of care gaps, Lanterman-Petris-Short (LPS) implementation considerations, patient rights under SB-43, and countywide community planning efforts for the FY 2026–2029 BHSA Integrated Plan across all Supervisorial Districts.
- Identified key forward-looking priorities including:
 - Enhancing transparency
 - Supporting stability amid funding uncertainties
 - Protecting core behavioral health infrastructure
 - Strengthening crisis services
 - Advancing prevention and youth supports
 - Promoting meaningful community input as state and federal policy changes progress.
