

## Procurements & Contract Extensions for Behavioral Health Services (BHS) Contracts

BHS is a specialty behavioral healthcare provider that serves approximately 113,000 residents annually through an network of County-operated programs and through more than 350+ community-based contracts.

- A majority of contracts are procured through a competitive solicitation process.
- Periodically, contracts for highly specialized services are procured through a single service provider.
- In general, contracts are procured for one (1) initial year, plus four (4) option years for a five (5) year contract term.
- As part of an administrative function, BHS requests authority on a semi-annual basis from the San Diego County Board of Supervisors (Board) to issue competitive procurements, single source contracts, or extend contracts.

The table below is a summary of recommendations that will be brought to the Board for approval **on June 9, 2026**. Actions support continuity of critical behavioral health care to beneficiaries, as required by Medi-Cal, and align with the BHS Optimal Care Pathways (OCP) models, to increase capacity based on projected community need.
