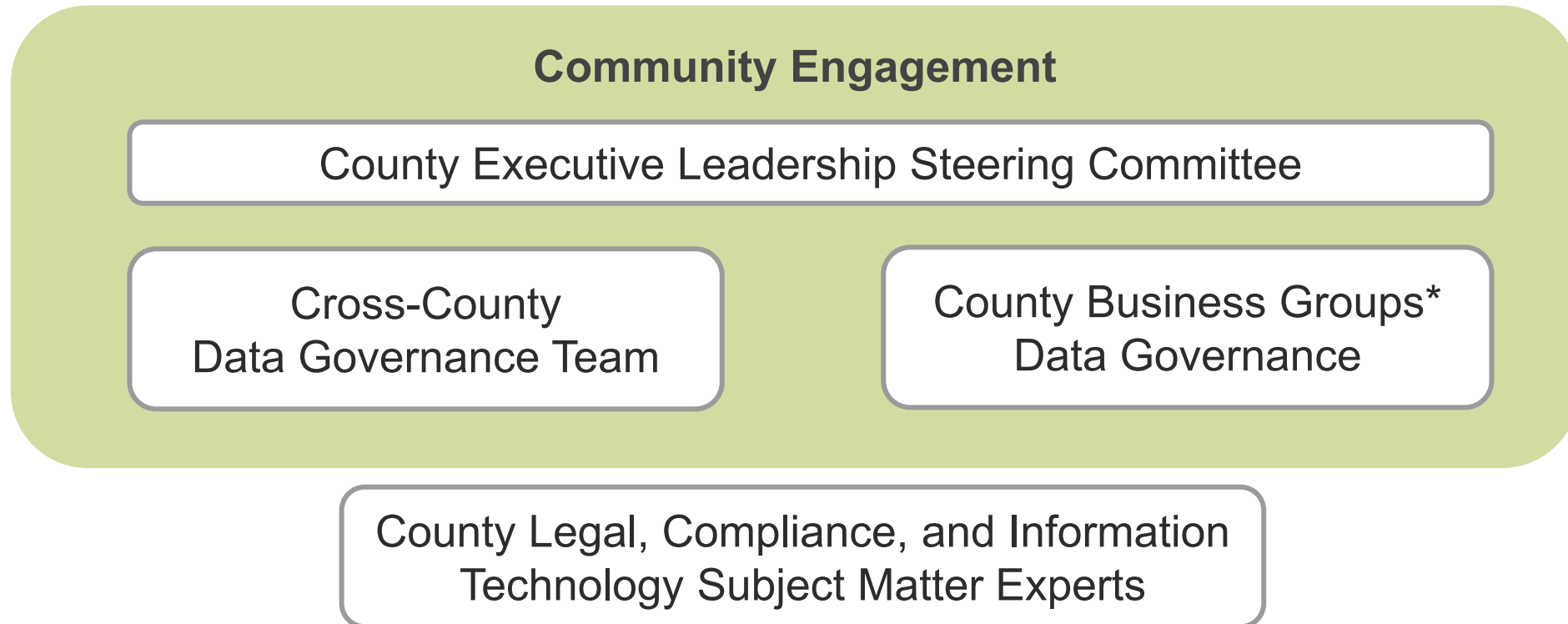

# DRAFT RECOMMENDATIONS



1. **Receive report** entitled Supporting Care Coordination for Justice-Involved Individuals through Funding and Integrated Data Infrastructure: Data Governance and Integration.
2. Direct the Chief Administrative Officer to **return to the Board in early 2024 with:**
  - a. Lessons learned from the **six-month data governance pilot**.
  - b. **Requests for any necessary resources** to prepare current systems for future data integration needs.
3. **Authorize the Chief Administrative Officer or designee to apply for and accept local, state, or federal funding** related to supporting health care and social service data interoperability and integration efforts for justice-involved populations.
4. **Amend the current report back schedule** as described in the May 10, 2022 (3) Board action of every 180 days and instead report back in early 2024.
