


 Initial May 2022 Board Letter requires a report back with a proposed data governance structure

DRAFT RECOMMENDATIONS



- 1. Receive report entitled Supporting Care Coordination for Justice-Involved Individuals through Funding and Integrated Data Infrastructure: Data Governance and Integration.
- 2. Direct the Chief Administrative Officer to return to the Board in early 2024 with:
 - a. Lessons learned from the six-month data governance pilot.
 - **b.** Requests for any necessary resources to prepare current systems for future data integration needs.
- 3. Authorize the Chief Administrative Officer or designee to apply for and accept local, state, or federal funding related to supporting health care and social service data interoperability and integration efforts for justice-involved populations.
- **4.** Amend the current report back schedule as described in the May 10, 2022 (3) Board action of every 180 days and instead report back in early 2024.
