Investing in Competitive Compensation



County Workforce Compensation

- The Board approved one-time payments and ongoing pay and flex credit increases
- Potential to draw on Medi-Cal (CalAIM) funds

Non-County Workforce Compensation

- Service budgets increased based on market costs, inclusive of workforce costs
- Under CalAIM, shift from cost reimbursement to procedure driven payment structure

Establishing Regional Training Centers of Excellence (COEs)



First Regional COE Pilot Established

- December 2022: Board directed execution of a grant agreement with Interfaith Community Services
- Pilot will serve as a means to test the COE concept, determine its scalability, and inform future plans for other potential COEs

Live Well Center for Innovation and Leadership Launched

October 2022: County established a Memorandum of Agreement with San Diego
 State University to enhance training, research, service, and workforce development

Consultant Conducted County-wide Employee Engagement Survey

Of the BHS Workforce, 40% feel that they "belong working here"

Pursuing Administrative Relief



BHS and DPC Procured a Consultant to Achieve Administrative Efficiencies

 Consultant to provide administrative relief recommendations and guidance on opportunities to leverage CalAIM payment reform

Building a Regional Workforce Training Fund

- MHSA Innovation Project Proposal
 - Program components:
 - Outcomes-Based Renewable Training and Tuition
 - Upskilling to Meet Professional Needs program
 - Tiered Loan Forgiveness and Home Ownership Incentives
 - Potential funding from American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funding
 - Updates will be provided in a separate staff report
