

# SHOCKING STATISTICS


The number of fatherless boys began increasing dramatically 40 years ago.

(73% fatherless)





# What it Costs Everyone

- It costs \$47,102 to incarcerate someone for one year.
- It costs \$500 to provide Boys to Men to a Young Man. We have Pizza Parties!



# BTM Budget



**Operating Budget: \$500,000**

Most Funds are from 100 Wave Challenge & 1 Wave Challenge

- 12 Paid Staff Members
- 100 volunteer Mentors

(30 of the 100 attending weekly)

# THE SAN DIEGO BTM LOCATION

More than 8,000 boys and men have participated in our program as of March 2012 within San Diego County. In August, 2009 we started a Boy to Men program in the public school system. This site-based group mentoring model has become a resounding success with school administrators, parents, mentors and most importantly...the boys.

These **Administrators** were so impressed,  
they asked for a BTM class, for their most  
at-risk boys, *during school hours.*

# USD CASE STUDY

- Conducted in September 2013
- Authored by Ian Martin, Ed.D., Erika Cameron, Ph.D., and Lauren Wolford, MA
- Of the total 46 participants, 23 were students of varying ethnicities:
  - 39% African American
  - 26% Hispanic
  - 13% Caucasian
  - 4% Native American
  - 4% Asian American
  - 8% Other





# Case study of Boys to Men

## Results:

- 91% of Parents agree their sons are more positive
- 91% of Parents agree their sons act more responsibly
- 100% of students said they felt accepted by the


