


Child Welfare Services Fiscal Year 2019/20 Statistics

Age of Children In Referrals



38,653 abuse/neglect reports were made to the Hotline which represents 68,964 children.


(Children can be counted more than once if referred multiple times throughout the year)

22,270 of those reports, including 42,400 of those children were assigned for investigation.

422 new Voluntary Services cases were opened during the year.

1,178 new petitions were filed on behalf of children.

Children Receiving Services as of July 1, 2020

3,530 children and youth in an open case:

- 358 young adults in Extended Foster Care (EFC)
- 966 children were receiving services in their home.
- 2,206 children were in out-of-home care:
 - 31% Kinship Care
 - 63% Non-kinship care
 - 31% Resource Family Homes
 - 10% Guardian and Court Specified Homes
 - 11% Foster Family Agency Homes
 - 7% Group Home
 - 3% San Pasqual Academy
 - 2% Temporary Shelter Care Facility
 - 4% Adoptions pending/finalized
 - 2% Other (e.g. trial home visits with parents, non-foster care placements)

North Coastal⁴

5,539 children (3,002 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2020:

269 children were receiving services

- 97% were dependents¹
- 1% were in voluntary services
- 2% were pending

151 were in out-of-home care

- 38% kinship care
- 61% non-kinship care
- 1% other

North Central³

4,807 children (2,666 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2020:

160 children were receiving services

- 76% were dependents¹
- 20% were in voluntary services
- 4% were pending

88 were in out-of-home care

- 20% kinship care
- 75% non-kinship care
- 5% other

Central

8,445 children (4,295 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2020:

508 children receiving services

- 83% were dependents¹
- 14% were in voluntary services
- 3% were pending

343 children were in out-of-home care

- 23% kinship care
- 72% non-kinship care
- 5% other

Centralized Child Welfare Services (CCWS)²

25,495 children (15,766 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2020:

1,059 children were receiving services

- 97% were dependents
- 2% were in voluntary services
- 1% were pending


An additional 357 youth were in EFC

960 children were in out-of-home care

- 30% kinship care
- 60% non-kinship care
- 1% other
- 9% adoptions pending

North Inland⁴

8,475 children (4,365 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2020:

319 children were receiving services

- 51% were dependents¹
- 46% were in voluntary services
- 3% were pending

158 were in out-of-home care

- 28% kinship care
- 70% non-kinship care
- 2% other

East

8,628 children (4,562 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2020:

422 children receiving services

- 73% were dependents¹
- 24% were in voluntary services
- 3% were pending

271 were in out-of-home care

- 36% kinship care
- 59% non-kinship care
- 5% other

South

7,575 children (3,997 families) referred with allegations of abuse or neglect.

On July 1, 2020:

395 children were receiving services

- 76% dependents¹
- 20% were in voluntary services
- 3% were pending

235 were in out-of-home care

- 38% kinship care
- 61% non-kinship care
- 1% other

¹ Children can be in three types of status: dependents, which are children receiving services ordered by the Juvenile Court; voluntary services; or pending.

² CCWS consists of Residential Services, Adoptions, Critical Assessment for Release Early (CARE), Child Abuse Hotline, Extended Foster Care, Indian Specialty Unit, Medical/Deaf Services Unit, and San Pasqual Academy. These programs serve all six regions.

³ The North Central Region includes the Medical/Deaf Services Unit

⁴ When a voluntary cases is opened in North Coastal, the case is transferred to North Inland.
