COVID-19 vaccine distribution is changing, but you can still get your COVID-19 vaccine.







What is COVID-19 commercialization?

As federal emergency funding for COVID-19 has ended, COVID-19 vaccines, treatments, and test kits will transition to the traditional healthcare marketplace.

Starting September 2023, public and private providers will order, distribute, and pay for COVID-19 vaccines.



What does commercialization mean for the community?

Most people can still get the COVID-19 vaccine at no cost.

For people who have private health insurance plans: Most plans will cover the COVID-19 vaccine at no cost. There may be fees for out-of-network care.

For people who don't have health insurance or with health plans that do not cover the cost: Get a free vaccine from local health centers; state, local, tribal, or territorial health department; and pharmacies participating in the <u>Bridge Access Program</u>.

For children eligible for the Vaccines for Children (VFC)

Program: Receive a vaccine from a <u>VFC enrolled provider</u>.
