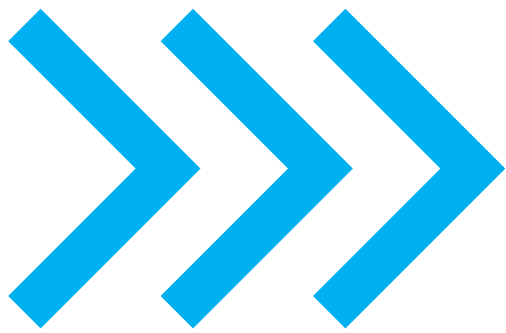


Hep B Vaccine: Your Questions *Answered*



How does hepatitis B spread?



Babies and children can get the hepatitis B virus during:

- Birth (from an infected pregnant person).
- Breastfeeding, touching open cuts or sores, or sharing personal items from an infected person.

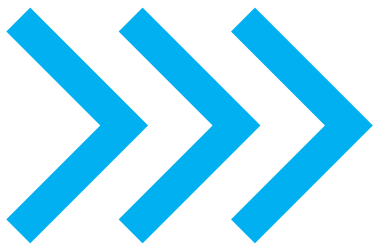


Why do newborns need the hepatitis B vaccine?

- Babies are **best protected** when they get the vaccine early.
- Without treatment or vaccination, 70%-90% of infants born to an infected parent will become infected themselves.



When should babies get the hepatitis B vaccine?



To be fully protected, children should get a dose of the hepatitis B vaccine at:

- Birth
- 1-2 months old
- 6-18 months old

Is the hepatitis B vaccine safe?

Yes!
