
MEASLES WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW







WHAT IS MEASLES?

Measles isn't just a little rash. Measles is a virus that can cause serious health complications, especially in children younger than 5 years old.

- Starts with a fever; then cough; runny nose; red, watery eyes (conjunctivitis); and rash.
- The rash starts at the hairline and face, then spreads down to the rest of the body.
- Tiny white spots may appear inside the mouth.

HOW MEASLES SPREADS

Measles is very contagious (spreads easily). If 1 person has measles, up to 9 out of 10 unvaccinated people nearby will become infected.

- Spread through the air when an infected person coughs or sneezes.
- The virus can live up to 2 hours in the air after the infected person leaves the area.



HOW TO PREVENT MEASLES

The best way to prevent measles is with the measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine.

• Children may get the measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella (MMRV) vaccine instead, which protects against chickenpox too.

KNOW IF YOU'RE PROTECTED AGAINST MEASLES

You're protected from measles if you have written documentation (records) showing:

- 2 MMR/MMRV doses, or
- Lab test showing immunity, or a history of measles.

If you're not sure, request:

- A copy of your vaccination records from your doctor, or <u>myvaccinerecord.cdph.ca.gov</u>.
- MMR/MMRV vaccine from your doctor, student health services, or find a clinic at MyTurn.ca.gov.
- Testing (blood work) from your doctor, or student health services.
