

PROTECT YOUR FARM AND FLOCK

Avian influenza (bird flu) can spread quickly and kill many birds in your backyard flock.

Bird flu can also make other animals, and even humans, sick. It is important to limit the contact your chickens have with other animals, pests, and people.



Cover and fence your coop.



Remove standing water and uneaten food.



Close and latch dumpsters securely.



Use decoys to deter wild birds.



Do not borrow or share equipment.



Limit visitors to your flock.



Use Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) when handling sick or dead animals, feces, litter, or raw milk.

IF YOU FEEL SICK:

<u>Call</u> your medical provider and let them know if you have been in contact with sick birds or other ill animals.

HOW TO REPORT:

Bird flu can cause your birds to quickly become sick and die. If you find an unusual number of sick or dead birds in your poultry flock, call the **California Department of Food and Agriculture** at **1-866-922-BIRD (2473)** right away. For other sick farm animals, call **(909) 947-5932**.

If dead wild birds are found, be sure to report those to the **California Department of Fish and Wildlife** by following the QR code below.
