STATE UPDATE ON INDOOR VS. OUTDOOR SERVICES — UPDATED 9/8/2020



INDOOR SERVICES

Allowed with BIG FOUR

- Limit indoor attendance to 25% of building capacity or a maximum of 100 attendees, whichever is lower.
- Safe Reopening Plan for indoor operations must be displayed at the entrance where people can view it.
 - It must be distributed to all employees and volunteers.

OUTDOOR SERVICES

Allowed with BIG FOUR

- CAPACITY: Capacity is limited to the "natural setting" – ensuring that households may physically distance from other households and wear facial coverings.
- Safe Reopening Plan for outdoor operations must be displayed where people can view it.
 - ➤ It must be distributed to all employees and volunteers.
- Vulnerable members of the population (over 65, compromised immune system or underlying condition) are strongly encouraged to participate through remote technology.

COHORT GUIDANCE



The cohort guidance applies to groups of children and youth in controlled, supervised, and indoor environments operated by local educational agencies, non profits, or other authorized providers, including, but not limited to, public and private schools; licensed and license-exempt child care settings; organized and supervised care environments, i.e., "distance learning hubs"; recreation programs; before and after school programs; youth groups; and day camps.

COHORT DEFINITION

Cohort: A cohort is a stable group of no more than 14 children or youth and no more than two supervising adults (or a configuration of no more than 16 individuals total in the cohort) in a supervised environment in which supervising adults and children stay together for all activities (e.g., meals, recreation, etc.), and avoid contact with people outside of their group in the setting.

- Utilizing cohorts minimizes the number of people exposed if a COVID-19 case is identified in a child or youth attendee, provider, other instructional support provider, or staff member of a particular cohort.
- Children or youth, attendees and adults in supervised care environments during the COVID-19 pandemic must be in groups as small as possible.
- While present at the supervised care environment, children or youth and supervising adults in one cohort must not physically interact with children or youth and supervising adults in other cohorts, other child facility staff, or parents of children or youth in other cohorts.








SINGING



Activities like singing and group recitation dramatically increase the risk of COVID-19 transmission.

- CDPH Guidance states, "Places of worship must discontinue indoor singing and chanting activities." (pg 3)
- Outdoor singing and chanting are allowable, as long as all participants are wearing face masks and are at least six feet apart.



How to Select, Wear, and Clean Your Mask





- The CDC has released <u>guidance</u> on masks.
- CDC recommends that you wear masks in public settings around people who don't live in your household and when you can't stay 6 feet away from others. Masks help stop the spread of COVID-19 to others.





REMEMBER THE "BIG FOUR"




TEMPERATURE & SYMPTOM SCREENINGS



- Provide temperature and/or symptom screenings for all employees and volunteers at the beginning of their shift.
- Encourage workers and congregants/visitors who are sick or exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19, or who have family members who are ill, to stay home.

2 PHYSICAL DISTANCING

- ♦ It is recommended that six feet of distance is allowed between individuals where feasible
- Implement measures to ensure physical distancing of at least six feet between workers and congregants/visitors, cars (for parking lot services) etc.
- For drive-in and parking lot services, maintain six feet distance between cars and people from different households.




REMEMBER

THE "BIG FOUR"

FACE COVERINGS

- All patrons/visitors must wear facial coverings.
- Remind congregants and visitors in advance to bring a face covering and make them available to anyone who arrives without one, if possible.
- Workers should wash or sanitize hands before and after using or adjusting face coverings.





4 INCREASED SANITATION

- Wash hands with soap and water regularly for at least 20 seconds.
- Perform thorough cleaning of high traffic areas such as lobbies, halls, chapels, meeting rooms, offices, libraries, and study areas and areas of ingress and egress including stairways, etc.
- Discourage sharing items used in worship and services (such as prayer books, cushions, prayer rugs, etc.) whenever possible and provide single use or digital copies.
