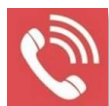


PPE Donations:

Testing Healthcare Workers:

Requests to have healthcare workers tested can be coordinated by calling 2-1-1. Press 1 to speak to the County Public Health Nurse Line. Physical health/medical, behavioral health, dental, and pharmacy workers are eligible.
