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### UPDATE ON HOTEL ROOMS:

As discussed during the May 15 telebriefing by Dr. Foster, the County is managing 30 hotel rooms for individuals who are asymptomatic, but are at high-risk, as defined as people who are over 65 or who have underlying health conditions (such as respiratory illness, compromised immunities, chronic disease), and who require a non-congregate setting as a physical distancing measure. This was put in place to supplement the rooms currently managed by RTFH. The priority are individuals moving from isolation or quarantine or a congregate setting. Referrals must be made by a medical provider, who has assessed the individual as healthy and stable enough to stay in this environment, and can be accessed by calling (858) 715-2350 between 7:00 A.M. and 9:00 P.M., 7 days a week. People staying in the rooms must understand they are expected to shelter in place at all times.
