New Telehealth Provider to Access Temporary Lodging

A new contracted telehealth service has been developed that will make it easier for Homeless Outreach Workers to place individuals in isolation/quarantine, should they need it.

If a team on the ground runs into someone displaying symptoms, they just need to call the Temporary Lodging Line (**858-715-2350**) and from there, they will be connected with the telehealth provider for an assessment. This is for instances when our Public Health Nurses are not immediately available to the team, but when they are working with a Homeless Outreach Team, they can still refer to the Temporary Lodging Line following their assessment.

Temporary Lodging Program



The County of San Diego has a Temporary Lodging Program for individuals affected by COVID-19 who do not have a place to safely quarantine or isolate.

Individuals may qualify for the program if they:

- Need to isolate - have been confirmed or are suspected of having COVID-19, **OR**

- Need to quarantine - have been identified as a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19;
- **AND** are able to function independently.

PUBLIC HEALTH GUIDANCE



Public Health Order Updates

[View the latest guidance for COVID-19 the order of the Health Officer and emergency regulations. \(Effective September 1, 2020\)](#)

- **Amended Section 8:**
 - Face coverings shall be worn as described and required in California Department of Public Health Face Covering Guidance issued on June 18, 2020, (available [here](#)).
- **Amended Section 11:**
 - **11a:** "Reopened business" is a business that is not an essential business as defined in section 10a, and has reopened in

conformance with the State of California's Plan for Reducing COVID-19 and Adjusting Permitted Sector Activities to Keep Californians Healthy and Safe (available [here](#)). Statewide Public Health Officer Order, issued by the California Department of Health Services on August 28, 2020, all portions of which are operative in San Diego County

Page 4 of 10 ORDER OF THE HEALTH OFFICER AND EMERGENCY REGULATIONS effective immediately (available [here](#)).

- **11b:** The State of California's Blueprint for a Safer Economy establishes a four tier system for reopening business sectors. Those business sectors listed in the "Substantial/Tier2" column of the Activities and Business Tiers chart are allowed to reopen under the conditions set forth in the chart.
 - i. Every business in the following sectors listed in the Activities and Business Tiers shall require all customers who receive services indoors or use indoor facilities to sign in with their name and telephone number:
 - 1. Hair Salons & Barbershops
 - 2. Personal Care Services
 - 3. Gyms & Fitness Centers
 - 4. Restaurants, Wineries, Bars, Breweries, and Distilleries (where meal is provided) as required in section g below.
- **11g:** All restaurants, bars, wineries, distilleries and breweries which are allowed to provide indoor service pursuant to the State of California Dine-in Restaurant Guidance shall comply with the following additional requirements applicable only to persons dining indoors:
 - i. Limiting persons sitting at a table to members of the same household is strongly encouraged.
 - ii. The restaurant shall obtain the name of each guest seated at a table and the telephone number of at least one guest and shall maintain the list of names and telephone numbers for three weeks.
 - iii. Guests will be required to wear face coverings at all times while in the facility, including when seated at a table before the meal is served and after the meal is finished.
- **Amended Section 15:**
 - **15 iv:** A religious service or cultural ceremony including a wedding ceremony which is allowed provided the [State Guidance on Places of Worship and Providers of Religious Services and Cultural](#)

[Ceremonies](#) is followed. However a wedding reception is a gathering and is not allowed.

- **15 v:** Outdoor protests in which participants maintain social distancing and wear face coverings at all times.



Reopening Webpage

On August 28th, the County of San Diego COVID-19 media briefing announced, per the governor of California, effective **August 31, 2020**: The following Businesses may operate with modifications & updated [Safe Reopening Plan](#).

- **Indoors with modifications, max of 25% capacity or 100 people, whichever is less:**
 - Restaurants - dine in
 - Places of worship
 - Movie theaters
 - Museums
- **Indoors with modifications, max 10% capacity:**
 - Gyms and fitness centers
- **Indoors with modifications:**
 - Hair salons and barbershops
 - Nail salons

The Blueprint for a Safer Economy

On August 28th, the Governor announced [The Blueprint for a Safer Economy](#).

The blueprint replaces the State Monitoring list for reducing COVID-19 in the state with revised criteria for loosening & tightening restrictions on activities. The focus will now be on case rates and positive tests. County of San Diego is currently in Tier 2 (Substantial).

Homeless Specific Budget Updates

County of San Diego News Article:

[San Diego County Adopts New Budget](#)

- New funding sets aside \$5.4 million to help the homeless at the San Diego Convention Center continue receiving on-site care after they move to new housing accommodations.
- Another \$15 million will pay for technology needs to support behavioral health services, including: telehealth, electronic health record upgrades, outreach and engagement, workforce recruitment and retention.
- A \$3 million increase will help address homelessness among youth up to the age of 24, with a focus on youth transitioning from foster care and young parents experiencing homelessness.
 - The Sheriff's Homeless Assistance Resource Team (HART) will see a \$2.6 million increase to expand its program.
- A \$23.7 million increase will address homelessness in the unincorporated area and another \$0.4 million will be used to develop a Flexible Housing Subsidy Pool in collaboration with the Regional Task Force on the Homeless to help move those experiencing homelessness into permanent housing.



Economic Impact Payment

In an effort to help as many low-income residents as possible, the IRS is doing outreach to non-filers of tax returns who may be eligible for \$1200 or more.
