Vaccinations are still important for facility staff and residents. If you have residents that are immobile, developmentally disabled, or have additional needs, email us at COVID-HealthcareStatus@sdcounty.ca.gov and we will work to assist you by having a team come out to provide vaccinations at your site.

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Although rare breakthrough cases are occurring at facilities, Please ensure infection control and prevention measures are being taken by staff, residents, and visitors in your facility. These protocols can not only help mitigate the spread of COVID-19 but also help in the spread as we enter flu season this fall and of other infectious organisms in your facilities. As a reminder, if you have a positive COVID-19 case at your facility, please report it by calling the County of San Diego Public Health Epidemiology Unit at (619) 692-8499 or (858) 565-5255 for after-hours or on the weekend. The County as well as your State licensing departments are here to support you.

Resource requests for PPE supply through the County Medical Operations Center Logistics program have reverted back to pre-COVID protocols whereby you are being referred back to your normal commercial supply chains for PPE supply. Supplies can only become available in urgent/emergency situations via email request to moc.logs.hhsa@sdcounty.ca.gov.

NEW: [AFL 21-08.3](#) to General Acute Hospitals, Acute Psychiatric Hospitals, Skilled Nursing Facilities - June 28, 2021
[Guidance on Quarantine for Health Care Personnel \(HCP\) Exposed to SARS-CoV-2](#) is now available. This revision includes updated risk assessment and quarantine guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for HCP working in hospitals and SNFs and SNF residents who have been fully vaccinated against SARS-CoV-2.

[AFL 20-38](#) to All Facilities - June 16, 2021
AFL revision updates and consolidates California Department of Public Health's (CDPH's) visitation guidance into single set of recommendations for all facilities in all counties, considering California is moving Beyond the Blueprint for a Safer Economy framework effective June 15, 2021.

[AFL 21-19](#) to Skilled Nursing Facilities - June 8, 2021
Annual notice to skilled nursing facilities (SNFs) and nursing facilities (NFs) regarding the availability of federal civil money penalty (CMP) funds that may be used to support projects that benefit and improve the care of residents.

[AFL 20-53](#) to Skilled Nursing Facilities - June 7, 2021
Provides updated recommendations from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) for SNFs conducting diagnostic screening testing of SNF health care personnel (HCP), and response-driven testing of SNF residents and HCP to prevent spread of COVID-19 in the facility informed by [CDC recommendations](#) and CMS requirements.

[AFL 20-89](#) to Skilled Nursing Facilities, Intermediate Care Facilities,

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online NATP for the provision of online NATP theory instruction. The SNF or ICF must either develop or use the contracted online school's clinical training to conduct the clinical portion of the NATP training in their facility using their own staff.

[AFL 20-22.8](#) to Long-Term Care Facilities - June 2, 2021

Authorizes LTC facilities to temporarily modify their facility's visitation policies in accordance with CMS and CDC COVID-19 guidance when necessary to protect the health and safety of residents, staff, and the public. It provides additional CDPH guidance for group activities and communal dining based upon vaccination status of residents.

Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services Visitation Guidance for Skilled Nursing Facilities

On May 11, 2021, CMS published an interim final rule with comment period (IFC). This rule establishes **Long-Term Care (LTC) Facility Vaccine Immunization Requirements for Residents and Staff**. This includes new requirements for educating residents or resident representatives and staff regarding the benefits and potential side effects associated with the COVID-19 vaccine, and offering the vaccine. Furthermore, LTC facilities must report COVID-19 vaccine and therapeutics treatment information to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN). Updated Survey Tools: CMS has updated tools used by surveyors to assess compliance with these new requirements. For details, please see [QSO-21-19-NH \(cms.gov\)](#).

Revised: The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services revised Skilled Nursing Facilities visitation guidance – April 27, 2021. For details, please see [QSO-20-39-NH Revised \(cms.gov\)](#). It is recommended to **follow the strictest guidance** when there is a discrepancy. Please always consult with your local licensing staff if you have questions.



Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Guidelines for Fully Vaccinated Individuals to Safely Visit with Others

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidance for fully vaccinated individuals and visitation – May 13, 2021. [When You've Been Fully Vaccinated | CDC](#). Fully vaccinated people can resume activities without wearing a mask or physically distancing, except where required by federal, state, local, tribal, or territorial laws, rules, and regulations, including local business and workplace guidance. These recommendations can help you make decisions about daily activities after you are fully vaccinated. They are not intended for [healthcare settings](#). Please always consult with your local licensing staff if you have questions.

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California COVID-19 Vaccination Program Update Federal Retail Pharmacy Program Activation

The [Federal Retail Pharmacy Program for COVID-19 Vaccination](#) program includes 21 participating national pharmacy partners that provide COVID-19 vaccinations at retail pharmacy locations. There are also [Long-term Care Pharmacies](#) distributing the COVID-19 vaccine through this program. Target population includes people 65+ and healthcare workers. Appointments will be required. Eligible Californians should NOT contact individual stores for appointments or come to the store seeking a vaccination without an appointment. For questions, please email:
