Greetings Long-Term Care and Residential Care Facilities of San Diego County,

Two State Public Health Orders were recently released by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) regarding health care worker vaccine requirements and visitation requirements in indoor settings, respectively.

The State Public Health Officer Order regarding [Health Care Worker Vaccine Requirements](#) states that all workers, paid and unpaid, who provide services or work in facilities licensed by CDPH and listed in the Order (such as Skilled Nursing Facilities) must have their first dose of a one-dose regimen or their second dose of two-dose regimen **by September 30, 2021**. Please see the Order in its entirety for information on exemptions, maintaining records, and more.

In addition, the State Public Health Officer Order regarding [Indoor Visitation Requirements](#) for General Acute Hospitals, Skilled Nursing Facilities, and Intermediate Care Facilities, states specific directives to be followed. These facilities must either 1) verify visitors are fully vaccinated, or 2) verify documentation of a negative SARS-CoV-2 test for unvaccinated or incompletely vaccinated visitors. Please see the Order in its entirety for information on masks, PPE, and physical distancing requirements as well.

At this time, these Orders do not apply to facilities licensed by the California Department of Social Services, Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD). If you

have questions, please contact your CCLD Licensing Program Analyst.

The County has a **variety of resources to assist with increasing vaccination rates**. We hope this [COVID-19 vaccination resource list for long-term care facilities](#) is helpful.

In addition, a reminder that the CDPH's BinaxNOW™ Antigen Testing Program for COVID-19 is available to all facilities, including CCLD-licensed Adult and Senior Care facilities. If your facility would like to conduct on-site COVID-19 testing, the best course of action for testing sustainability, ease, and resources is to apply through CDPH and use their process and CLIA waiver for the rapid antigen test kits. The County can supply and deliver test kits once approved. Another important reminder is that **Monoclonal Antibody Treatments** are available and help treat COVID-19. Health Advisory Update #38: Coronavirus Disease 2019

Key Messages

- Circulating SARS-CoV-2 variants of concern, especially the highly infectious Delta variant (B.1.617.2), are accelerating spread of infection.
 - Unvaccinated persons account for most new COVID-19 infections, hospitalizations, and deaths.
 - Increasing vaccination for COVID-19 can prevent: surges in COVID-19 related morbidity and mortality, overwhelming healthcare capacity, and widening existing health disparities

County of San Diego Public Health Laboratory

The County of San Diego Public Health Laboratory closed temporarily effective 7/1/2021 and will not be able to process COVID-19 samples due to unforeseen events. Your facility will be notified once operations and services have been restored.

Your testing needs and that of the entire community in San Diego are very important to us. During this time, facilities will need to utilize other laboratory resources for testing services to test staff and residents. These other laboratories could be local hospitals with testing capacity in your area or commercial laboratories that conduct COVID-19 testing (see *Table #1* below for commercial laboratory contact information).

NEW: [AFL 20-53.5](#) to Skilled Nursing Facilities - August 3, 2021

This AFL revision includes reference to the July 26, 2021 Public Health Order requiring SARS-CoV-2 diagnostic screening testing for Skilled Nursing Facility healthcare personnel that are unvaccinated or incompletely vaccinated.

[AFL 21-30](#) to Intermediate Care Facilities - August 3, 2021

This AFL requires twice-weekly SARS-CoV-2 diagnostic screening testing for HCP that are unvaccinated or incompletely vaccinated. Facilities must develop and implement processes for verifying the vaccination status of all HCP, and for obtaining and tracking documentation of results of weekly SARS-CoV-2 diagnostic screening testing from HCP who are not fully vaccinated when reasonably possible with full compliance no later than August 23, 2021.

[AFL 21-29](#) to Health Care Facilities - August 3, 2021

This AFL requires weekly SARS-CoV-2 diagnostic screening testing for healthcare personnel (HCP) that are unvaccinated or incompletely vaccinated working the above specified in health care facilities. Facilities must develop and implement processes for verifying the vaccination status of all HCP, and for obtaining and tracking documentation of results of weekly SARS-CoV-2 diagnostic screening testing from HCP who are unvaccinated or incompletely vaccinated as soon as reasonably possible with full compliance no later than August 23, 2021.

[AFL 21-28](#) to Skilled Nursing Facilities - August 3, 2021

This AFL requires SNFs to develop and implement processes for verifying the vaccination status of all HCP and for obtaining and tracking documentation of results of SARS-CoV-2 diagnostic screening testing from HCP who are unvaccinated or incompletely vaccinated and includes additional PPE requirements. These requirements are effective August 9th and should begin as soon as reasonably possible, with full compliance no later than August 23, 2021.

The Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) of the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) publishes [Provider Information Notices \(PINs\)](#) to communicate important license related information to CCLD-licensed providers. NEW: [PIN 21-32.1-ASC](#) to All Adult and Senior Care Program Residential Licensees, August 11, 2021

This PIN supersedes PIN 21-32-ASC. It includes routine diagnostic screening testing guidance for facility staff in Adult and Senior Care residential facilities. This PIN also provides updated guidance related to N95 respirators and surgical masks for facility staff. In addition, it removes the proof of vaccination requirement identified in PIN 21-32-ASC that the QR code must confirm the vaccine record as an official record of the State of California. Underlined text in this PIN indicates where additions have been made.

NEW: PIN 21-13-CCLD to All Community Care Licensed Providers, August 11, 2021

This PIN informs providers about the need to prepare for and respond to long-term drought conditions and how to receive drought drought-related assistance from CCLD.

NEW: [PIN 21-14-CCLD](#) to All Community Care Licensing Facility Licensees, August 10, 2021

This PIN provides information on the Everbridge Emergency Notification System and how it will continue to be used to notify licensees in advance of, or during, natural disasters such as wildfires, Public Safety Power Shutoffs, earthquakes, flash floods, and more.

[PIN 21-35-ASC](#) to All Adult and Senior Care Program Residential Licensees, July 30, 2021

This PIN delays implementation of [PIN 21-31-ASC](#), dated July 21, 2021, and announces a *temporary delay* in the resumption of inspections using the Community Care Licensing Division's (CCLD) full inspection tools, known as the CARE Tools, which were scheduled to resume on August 1, 2021.

[PIN 21-34-ASC](#) to All Adult and Senior Care Program Residential Licensees, July 30, 2021

This PIN provides an update to information provided in PIN 20-32-ASC, dated September 28, 2020, on an important licensee COVID-19 status survey regarding the COVID-19 vaccine that will be disseminated via the Everbridge Mass Notification System

The Evaluator Manual document *Reference Material for Complaints* has been reorganized and revised to improve usability and to ensure all procedures and information are current. It provides a guide to the Community Care Licensing Division's complaint process for Licensing Program Analysts and the public. [PIN 21-33-ASC](#) to All Adult Day Program Providers, July 27, 2021

This PIN provides updated guidance on infection control specific to Adult Day Programs and addresses topics most frequently addressed by providers related to the prevention, mitigation, and containment of COVID-19. This PIN provides new guidance to providers on testing and masking requirements pursuant to the updated [State Public Health Officer Order](#) from CDPH issued on July 26, 2021.

BinaxNOW™ Antigen Testing Program for COVID-19

REMINDER: The CDPH's BinaxNOW™ Antigen Testing Program for COVID-19 is available to all CCLD-licensed ASC facility types. This CDPH-run program offers many benefits and user-friendly features including a process for CCLD-licensed facilities to obtain a free Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) waiver, which is necessary for antigen testing. These point-of-care (POC) antigen diagnostic tests detect the presence of the SARS-CoV-2 virus and can provide results in less than 20 minutes. Antigen tests have been added to the COVID-19 testing arena to meet the growing demand. If you are interested in receiving these test kits, you must have a Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments (CLIA) waiver. Click below to get started.

Monoclonal Antibody Treatment Available at New Locations!

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration issued an [Emergency Use Authorization \(EUA\)](#) for a monoclonal antibody therapy combination called REGEN-COV, comprised of the casirivimab and imdevimab monoclonal antibodies from Regeneron. This life-saving combination therapy is authorized for the treatment of mild to moderate COVID-19 in symptomatic patients with positive SARS-CoV-2 results who are 12 years of age and older weighing at least 40 kg and at [high risk](#) for progressing to severe COVID-19 disease and/or hospitalization. [High risk persons](#) include those ≥ 65 years of age, OR with a BMI ≥ 25 , OR with diabetes, OR pregnancy, OR who have certain chronic medical conditions. Other medical conditions or factors (such as, race or ethnicity) may qualify a patient as [high risk](#). See the [EUA](#) the combination of casirivimab and imdevimab and the [California Health Alert Network – San Diego \(CAHAN-SD\)](#) for more details.

Treatment should be administered as soon as possible following a positive test result, preferably within 72 hours of symptom onset and no later than 10 days after symptoms begin. Refer medically eligible individuals by calling (619) 685-2500. Patients may self-refer by also calling (619) 685-2500.

Accepting all medically eligible patients, regardless of health insurance or immigration status.

Eligible Californians should NOT contact individual stores for appointments or come to the store seeking a vaccination without an appointment.
